



CRIME ALERT

THREATS

The Southern University at New Orleans Police Department (SUNOPD) is investigating a threat made by a student at Rooted High School. A student has been identified as a suspect in the threat investigation and is currently in custody. SUNOPD was notified of the incident by school Administrators who were alerted by a concerned parent.

Although there is currently no active threat, SUNOPD is using an abundance of caution. As a precautionary measure, SUNOPD has assigned an officer to the immediate area and temporarily installed a weapons detector at the entrance to the school. As always, we take every report of a threat, or rumor of a threat, seriously to help ensure our campus and surrounding community are secure and our students are safe. Our highest priority continues to be the safety of our campus community members and the security of our campus."

This information is being released in accordance with the federal Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act of 1990.
