PURPOSE: The purpose of the Mobile Command Center (MCC) is to provide workspace and communication stations for field command operations.

POLICY: The vehicle will be used as a mobile command post for emergency situations which require extended communications and control functions.

PROCEDURE:

- A. The MCC may be used as a command post during disaster or emergency response situations. The vehicle may also be used as a command post for Sheriff's Office special operations.
 - 1. The MCC is a regional asset and as such may be utilized for deployment to other jurisdictions in cases of mutual assistance requests.
 - 2. Due its unique function, the MCC may be deployed to community events as a static demonstration, with an operator to answer the public's questions about the functions and deployment.
 - 3. The Specialized Services Captain will be responsible for authorizing the use of the MCC.
- B. REQUESTING THE MOBILE COMMAND CENTER:
 - 1. During normal business hours, all requests to use the MCC will be directed to the Specialized Services Captain or designee.
 - 2. If the need for the MCC occurs after hours, the watch commander, or designee, will contact Dispatch and provide the following information:
 - a. A description of the situation
 - b. Location and description of the physical area to where the MCC will respond
 - c. Estimated length of time the MCC will be needed
 - d. A contact telephone number

- 3. Dispatch will contact the OES on-call volunteer coordinator, who will then seek the approval of the Specialized Services Captain or designee to authorize the response of the MCC.
- C. The MCC may only be operated by personnel with the following qualifications:
 - 1. The driver must possess a valid class "B" driver license.
 - 2. The driver must have completed familiarization training of the MCC.
 - 3. A list of drivers and operators will be maintained by OES.
 - 4. The Sergeant of Transportation will ensure that deputies assigned to operate the MCC and equipment keep their skills current with on-going in-service training.
 - 5. The operator must have completed the familiarization training and be proficient in operating and troubleshooting the generator, satellite system, telephones, computers, external lighting, television monitors, camera, computers, and radios.
- D. All equipment and supplies stored in the MCC may be utilized for deployment to any emergency. A list of supplies will be maintained in the MCC and available for inventory prior to deployment and upon return so that supplies can be replenished.
- E. Deputies will perform basic maintenance, pre-inspection, and safety checks of the vehicle as taught during training. Maintenance and repairs that are beyond the deputies' training or ability will be conducted by authorized personnel.
- F. Any damage to the MCC or equipment will be reported to the Specialized Services Captain.
- G. At least monthly, the MCC shall be tested, and the following systems will be verified as operational:
 - 1. All radios
 - 2. All computers
 - 3. Televisions/monitors
 - 4. Internet connections
 - 5. Satellite television
