

IF YOU ARE THE VICTIM OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE OR ABUSE, you can ask the district attorney to file a criminal complaint. You also have the right to go to the circuit court and file a petition requesting any of the following orders for relief:

(a) An order restraining your attacker from abusing you;

(b) An order directing your attacker to leave your household;

(c) An order preventing your attacker from entering your residence, school, business or place of employment;

(d) An order awarding you or the other parent custody of or parenting time with a minor child or children;

(e) An order restraining your attacker from molesting or interfering with minor children in your custody;

(f) An order awarding you other relief the court considers necessary to provide for you or your children's safety, including emergency monetary assistance.

Such orders are enforceable in every state. You may also request an order awarding support for minor children in your care or for your support if the other party has a legal obligation to support you or your children. You also have the right to sue for losses suffered as a result of the abuse, including medical and moving expenses, loss of earnings or support, and other out-of-pocket expenses for injuries sustained and damage to your property. This can be done without an attorney in the small claims department of a court if the total amount claimed is under \$7,500.

Oregon law provides that it is a crime to assault or menace any person, whether or not that person is a family member. The Linn County District Attorney will review police reports and decide whether to file a criminal complaint and prosecute this case.

NOTICE TO VICTIMS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

The Benton County District Attorney's Office will review the police report of your case and decide whether to file criminal charges against your abuser. It is not necessary for you to "press charges."

The District Attorney's Victim Assistance Program will try to call you after they receive the police reports.

If the Victim Assistance Program is unable to reach you, you may call them at 541-766-6688 to find out the status of the case.
