Section 1: Significant Incidents

Case AR24-006942

On April 24, 2024, at approximately 10:39 pm, officers responded to an injury crash near the 6400 block of Sheridan Blvd. Officers arrived and determined that a BMW coupe was traveling northbound on Sheridan Blvd and collided with a large box truck turning southbound on Sheridan Blvd.

Three individuals were transported to a hospital for treatment. The driver of the BMW suffered serious bodily injuries and the driver and passenger of the box truck were treated for minor injuries. Alcohol is believed to be a factor in this crash and the case is under investigation.

Case AR24-007036

On April 26, 2024, at approximately 4:19 pm, officers responded to an injury crash involving a motorcycle near the 6300 block of Ward Rd. The investigation revealed an SUV was traveling northbound on Ward Rd and made a westbound turn onto W 63rd Ave. A motorcycle was traveling southbound on Ward Rd and collided with the SUV.

The motorcycle rider suffered serious bodily injury and was transported to a hospital where he was later pronounced deceased. This case is under investigation.

Case AR24-007082

On April 27, 2024, at approximately 11:14 pm, officers were dispatched to a welfare check at W 52nd Ave and Wadsworth Blvd. A caller reported that a female was stopped at a green light and seemed disoriented. The vehicle eventually started traveling north and was observed by officers near W. 56th Ave and Wadsworth Bypass. The driver failed to maintain lanes, drove

on the shoulder for a substantial period of time, and nearly hit a traffic signal pole.

The driver failed to yield to officers from W. 56th Ave and Wadsworth Bypass to W. 64th and Kendall St. Officers intervened and stopped the vehicle. The driver was arrested on suspicion of DUI.
