To communicate ASU's position regarding the ethical, responsible conduct and reporting of research and scholarly activity

# **Applicability**

Faculty, academic professionals, classified, administrative and university staff, and students.

### **Policy**

As an institution devoted to the creation of new knowledge through <u>research</u> and scholarship, ASU is committed to maintaining the integrity and truthfulness fundamental to these activities through the responsible and ethical conduct of its faculty, academic professionals, staff, and students. To this end, the university has established procedures for dealing with alleged <u>misconduct</u>. In addition to addressing allegations of misconduct, these procedures are intended to protect innocent researchers and scholars from harassment, to prevent interference with their academic freedom, and to protect from retribution those who report alleged misconduct. The president, through the vice president for research, has assigned the initial responsibility for handling <u>inquiry</u> and <u>investigations</u> into allegations of misconduct in research to the vice president for research.

This policy will be supplemented, as appropriate, with the provisions of the US Health and Human Services, Office of Research Integrity Model Policies and Procedures, and other applicable federal agencies to ensure compliance with federal law and protection of those involved in the process.
