

Baltimore Police Department 2025 In-Service Training

Attached is an overview of the 2025 In-Service Training plan. Based on survey and advisory committee input, the 2025 In-Service Training was developed to be a 4-day, modular course. While most members will take all four days of training sequentially, the training is designed to be flexible and accommodate the rotating weekends that come with staffing a 24/7 police agency. All members must complete all 4 days of training in 2025. However, supervisors may schedule them throughout the year as needed.

The 2025 In-Service Training program was developed as the result of a Training Needs Assessment that included:

- Review of <u>State Training Mandates</u>, including training on: Use of Force & De-Escalation; Cultural and Gender Diversity; Implicit Bias; Contact with and treatment of victims of crimes and delinquent acts; Notices, services, support & rights available to victims/ Victim's representative under MD law; Notifications of victims of identity fraud & related crimes of their rights under Federal law; and Anti-Discrimination.
- Review of <u>Consent Decree Training Mandates</u>, including training on: Behavioral Health; Stop, Search, and Arrest; Use of Force; and Community Policing.
- Review of Federal and Partner Training Mandates
- Review of Independent Monitoring Team Assessments
- Changes in <u>Maryland Law</u> and <u>BPD Policy</u>
- Training Advisory Committee consultation (internal BPD working group)
- Community Training Review Committee (community members and representatives from across the city)
- Performance Review Board Recommendations
- Review of Audits and Inspections data
- Review of Public Integrity Bureau sustained misconduct data
- Review of annual training survey distributed to all sworn members
- Review of 2024 post-training surveys from members
- National issues and trends
- And consultation with internal BPD units such as: Use of Force Assessment Unit, Records Management, Data Driven Strategies Division, Community Policing, and Victim Services.

Principles of Rescue Task Force PowerPoint ² Lesson Plan	Overview of Rescue Task Force, a system designed to get medical treatment into the "warm zone" of an Active Threat incident.

Tactical Medical Treatment <u>PowerPoint</u> <u>Lesson Plan</u>	Refresher on field-based trauma care. It will provide officers basic knowledge and techniques to provide care to citizens and themselves in the field during the critical first moments after a traumatic event.
Narcan/Overdose Response <u>PowerPoint</u> <u>Lesson Plan</u>	The Law Enforcement Naloxone Program will certify all students in the administration of Naloxone/NARCAN when responding to calls for service where a potential opioid overdose is involved.
