Chief Brian K. Gibbons began his law enforcement career in 1999 with the City of Orange Police Department, serving in the Patrol Division, Emergency Services Unit, Field Training Unit, and as PBA President. In September 2002, he joined the Chatham Borough Police Department, where he worked in patrol before advancing to the Accreditation Unit in 2005 as Assistant Accreditation Manager, helping the agency earn its first Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA) International Accreditation—a distinction held by few New Jersey departments at the time.

Over the years, Chief Gibbons rose through the ranks—promoted to Sergeant in 2007, Lieutenant/Executive Officer in 2010, Captain in 2015, and Chief of Police in 2018. In addition to commanding the department's daily operations, he has served as Accreditation Manager, Field Training Officer, Training/Community Services Unit Supervisor, Emergency Services Unit Commander, and Internal Affairs Commander.

He holds an Associate of Science Degree with honors from Essex County College, as well as Bachelor of Arts and Master of Administrative Science Degrees from Fairleigh Dickinson University, where he also earned postgraduate certificates in Emergency Management Administration and Administrative Science. Chief Gibbons is a NJ Certified Public Manager (CPM) and a Police Training Commission (PTC) certified instructor who taught criminal law, environmental crimes, and the Alcohol Beverage Control Act at the Morris County Police Academy for more than 15 years.

A Certified Accreditation Assessor and graduate of the NJSACOP Police Executive Institute, Chief Gibbons holds both the Certified Eligible Law Enforcement Executive (C-ELEE) and Advanced Accredited Command Executive (ACE) credentials. He previously served nearly a decade on the executive board of the NJ Public Safety Accreditation Coalition (NJPSAC) as Chief Financial Officer—earning its Honor Award in 2008—and now serves as a commissioner on the NJSACOP Board of Law Enforcement Accreditation, designated by the U.S. Department of Justice as an Independent Credentialing Body.



He was employed at Drew University in Madison as a Campus Police Officer from March of 1983 through October of 1985 when he became a member of the Chatham Borough Police Department as a Telecommunicator. He was sworn in as a Police Officer in February of 1987.

Officer Bochniak was assigned to the Detective Bureau in September of 2002. During his time in the Bureau he conducted investigation into criminal activities, such as burglary, theft, sexual assaults, bank robbery, vandalism, fraud, domestic disputes and worked closely with federal agencies such as FBI, Secret Service, ATF, the US Postal Service, as well as the prosecutor's office for upcoming trials.

He was promoted to the rank of Sergeant in August 2005 and was reassigned to the Patrol Division as the supervisor of a squad. In May of 2006, Sergeant Bochniak was again re-assigned to the Detective Bureau as the Detective/Sergeant and retired from the Department in November of 2011.

In May of 2013, Michael Bochniak was temporarily employed by Chatham Borough and assigned as the acting Parking Enforcement Officer. In July of 2013 his employment became permanent. He continues to serve the Borough community as a civilian parking enforcement officer until August of 2017, when he was hired for the position of the Executive Administrative Assistant.
