# 1. REVISION TO PROCEDURE 12.020, UNIFORMS, RELATED EQUIPMENT, AND PERSONAL GROOMING

Procedure 12.020, Uniforms, Related Equipment, and Personal Grooming, has been revised.

- Language concerning personal grooming standards has been added to the procedure.
- Words, "unkempt, ragged, or extreme," have been removed.
- Language concerning wearing of the uniform hat and hair length security has been added.
- Additional language concerning hair length, color, care, and restrictions has been added to the procedure.
- Sworn employees called to extended Military Active Duty for more than 60 days, will turn in all issued equipment to Police Supply, except their Department identification and badge.
- Firearms must be turned in and stored at the Target Range.

This revision is effective immediately. Personnel should review Procedure 12.020 in its entirety. The revised procedure is available through the **Power DMS** portal.
