# 1. REMINDER TO OFFICERS CONDUCTING A CUSTODIAL TRANSPORT

Department personnel are reminded Procedure 12,110, Handling Suspected Mentally III Individuals and Potential Suicides, requires officers transporting suspected mentally ill individuals to Psychiatric Emergency Services (PES) to complete a Minor Aided Case report in the Records Management System (RMS).

Officers are also reminded Procedure 12.430, Endangering Children, requires making a blotter entry, which includes notification to Personal Crimes Squad (PCS), whenever officers place children in the physical custody of 241-KIDS and there is a concern about endangerment. This both documents the officer's actions as well as serves as a secondary notification for PCS.

# 2. SUBMISSION AND APPROVAL OF FORM 678, CHANGE IN COURT APPEARANCE, TO BE CLOSELY SCRUTINIZED

The Hamilton County Prosecutor's Office contacted the Department to share concerns regarding a significant increase in change of court requests (Form 678) submitted for Common Pleas cases. Compared to 2021, there was a 23% increase in change of court requests through November of this year.

Members are reminded that **only** illness, injury, or cases scheduled on days previously entered in CMS as vacation or training days qualify for submission of a Form 678. Supervisors shall thoroughly review the circumstances with the officer prior to approving a Form 678.

Personnel are reminded Form 678 does not eliminate the need for the affected Common Pleas case prosecutor to be contacted, as far in advance as possible, to be made aware of the officer's absence. Notification shall be made by either the requesting officer or the approving supervisor as the situation dictates.

The **AXON for Investigators** course has been designed to employ the "train the trainer concept" enabling investigators from District Investigative Units, District Violent Crimes Squads, CGIC, Narcotics Unit, Vice Squad, and Personal Crimes Squad to categorize BWC videos and create files in AXON.

The course will benefit all investigators, enhance case and court preparation, and prevent BWC evidence from being deleted.

Each of the District Investigative Units, Violent Crimes Squads, and other units/squads referenced above should send a minimum of two investigators to this course to become the "trainers" for their units of assignment.
