1. REVISION TO FORM 55, LETTER OF UNDERSTANDING

Department Form 55, Letter of Understanding, has been revised.

The revised Form 55 is to be used for all agreements being entered into which will occur on or after **Sunday**, **January 1**, **2023**. The hourly rate for the use of a police vehicle has increased to \$25.00/hour.

This revision is effective immediately. Revised Form 55 is available in the CPDFORMS folder on the H: drive of Department computers. The revised Form 55 reflects a revision date of "11/04/22." Previous versions of this form shall no longer be used.

2. REVISION TO FORM 301I, CRIME OR INCIDENT INFORMATION

Form 301I, Crime or Incident Information, has been revised. Minor changes to language and existing data fields have been updated at the request of Police Records Section. Additionally, Police Records Section will be adding Form 301I to the Police Department's Records Retention Schedule and Records Destruction list.

This revision is effective immediately. Revised Form 3011 is available in the CPDFORMS folder on the H: drive of Department computers. Previous versions of this form shall no longer be used.

3. TRAVEL REIMBURSEMENT – CHANGE IN POLICY DIRECTIVE

The City of Cincinnati Finance Department implemented a change in policy impacting employee travel reimbursement. As a result of the City Finance Department policy shift, Planning & Inspections Section will be publishing a revision to Procedure 16.125, Travel on City Business, in the upcoming weeks.

In the interim, and effective immediately, employees are directed not to pay expenditures with their personal credit card.

All travel expenses must have prior approval. Once approved, registration, lodging, and airfare will be paid with City travel card. Central Payroll will enter the agreed reimbursable amount into the CHRIS Payroll System for payment to the employee's next available payroll check. Personnel should direct travel expense reimbursement related questions to Lynnette Lowery, Finance Management, at 513-352-4863.

4. REQUESTING DONATED TIME FOR ANDRE EWING

Police Officer Andre Ewing, District Two, has exhausted his leave time balances due to an extended medical leave.

As a reminder, leave may be donated as follows:

5. REFUSING OR ACCEPTING DEFENSE SUBPOENAS OR SUMMONS

All Department personnel, especially those assigned to the district front desks, are reminded they **should not** accept defense subpoenas or summons addressed or directed to another individual employee by name.

Per the Law Department, if subpoena/summons service by the defense is attempted on an employee that is not the person to whom the subpoena/summons is addressed, the employee should refuse service, unless:

- The person named on the subpoena/summons can be located to personally accept service; or
- The person named specifically advises the intermediate employee to accept service on their behalf.

If the person named cannot be located or contacted, service should be refused.

Subpoenas/summons improperly served by simply being dropped off at a district for a specific employee and failing to make it to that named individual could result in the Court's belief there was proper service because the return states the service occurred.

This directive does <u>not</u> apply to any subpoena addressed to the "City of Cincinnati" or "Cincinnati Police Department" as organizations. Direct any questions regarding refusal or acceptance of subpoenas/summons to Mr. Mark Manning, City of Cincinnati Law Department, at 513-352-4576, for assistance. General questions about responding to a subpoena should be directed to the Civil Litigation Section of the Law Department, at 513-352-3334.

6. POLICE CHIEF'S ADVISORY BOARD APPLICATIONS

Interim Police Chief Theetge is reconstituting an internal Police Chief's advisory board. Members will have the opportunity to impact Departmental operations more directly through constructive and professional discussions in furtherance of the Department's mission.

This opportunity is open to all civilian and sworn ranks below captain. Meetings will be held at least quarterly but may occur more frequently. Membership on the board will be for a one-year term. Any member interested in participating should submit a Form 17 through the chain of command by **Sunday**, **January 15**, **2023**.
