ACTION: Amends general order dated October 1, 2022.

<u>09.19.0</u> <u>PURPOSE</u>

The purpose of this general order is to establish a standard method for documenting incidents reported to or observed by Concord Police Department coworkers and to establish a procedure for records management.

09.19.1 **POLICY**

The policy of the Concord Police Department shall be to accurately document incidents reported to or observed by Concord Police Department coworkers in accordance with the requirements of the National Incident Based Reporting System and the NC Division of Motor Vehicles. It shall further be the policy of the department to maintain a comprehensive system of records maintenance and utilization to support and assist with the effective delivery of police services.

09.19.2 **DEFINITIONS**

A. ARREST REPORT

An arrest report is a record maintained by a law enforcement agency concerning an arrest, including arrestee information, related charge information, and a narrative of the arrest.

B. CASE SUPPLEMENT REPORT

A report used to document changes to the original incident report and/or record additional information pertinent to the incident report.

C. COMPUTER AIDED DISPATCH (CAD)

A dispatch system that uses computers for the efficient assignment of calls for service, and the entry and/or retrieval of incidents or calls for service data.

D. CRASH REPORT (REPORTABLE)

A reportable crash shall involve a motor vehicle that results in one or more of the following: death or injury of a human being and/or total property damage of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or more, or property damage of any amount to a vehicle seized pursuant to NCGS 20-28.3 (Seizure, impoundment, forfeiture of motor vehicles for offenses involving impaired driving while license revoked or without license and insurance, and for felony speeding to elude arrest).

E. CRASH REPORT (NON-REPORTABLE)

A non-reportable crash shall include a motor vehicle crash not included in 09.19.2D.

F. EVENT IDENTIFICATION NUMBER (EVENT ID)

A numbering system in which CAD assigns a unique number to every dispatched call.

G. INCIDENT REPORT

An incident report shall include one or more offenses committed by the same offender, or group of offenders acting in concert, at the same time or place.

H. NATIONAL INCIDENT BASED REPORTING SYSTEM (NIBRS)

A systematic crime reporting program used to compile local, state, and national crime statistics.

NIBRS GROUP A OFFENSES

Twenty-eight group A offense categories, which include seventy-one group A offenses listed on attachment #1.

J. ORIGINATING CASE AGENCY (OCA)

A unique case identifier within a law enforcement agency.

K. RECORDS MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (RMS)

The department's computerized system for central records management.

09.19.3 PHYSICAL SECURITY AND CONTROLLING ACCESS TO DEPARTMENT FILES

- A. The Customer Service Unit is located within the police department, which requires an electronic keycard for entry.
- B. Records information is accessible 24 hours a day to authorized users through RMS.
- C. A password is used to access RMS. The access or rights to certain modules are determined by rank and/or assignment within the department.
- D. The Customer Service Unit sergeant shall be notified anytime a coworker is separated from employment.

- E. The Customer Service Unit sergeant shall remove the former coworker's access to RMS.
- F. The release of department records shall be in accordance with applicable state and federal laws, and departmental directives.

09.19.4 REPORT TYPE, ERROR CORRECTION

- A. All reports required or permitted under this general order shall be submitted in digital format. Hand-written reports shall only be accepted when the digital reporting system is not working.
- B. Reports entered into RMS require a supervisor's approval.
- C. All reports containing errors or inconsistencies shall be returned to the submitting officer for correction.

09.19.5 CASE NUMBERING SYSTEM

CAD assigns an OCA to each incident, arrest, and crash report. This assigned unique number incorporates the year and sequential number. (i.e., 2100145, 2100146)

09.19.6 REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

- A. A police record shall be required for each incident occurring within the department's service area in the following categories:
 - 1. Citizen reports of crime;
 - 2. Citizen complaints;
 - 3. Incidents resulting in an officer being dispatched or assigned;
 - 4. Criminal and non-criminal cases initiated by officers;
 - 5. Incidents involving arrests, citations, or criminal summons.
- B. Appropriate reporting of the incidents specified above shall be determined by the nature of the incident, the information gathered, and the action taken.
- C. Any report documenting police activity shall include, at a minimum, the following information:
 - 1. OCA Number or Event ID Number;
 - 2. Type of report;
 - 3. Date and time of initial reporting;
 - 4. Name (if available) of the requestor, victim, or complainant;

- 5. Nature of the incident;
- 6. Nature, date and time of action taken (if any) by the officer.

09.19.7 INCIDENT REPORTS

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- A. Incident reports shall follow the guidelines outlined in the NIBRS User Manual.
- B. All incident reports that list location of incident in the City of Concord shall list only the number, street, and designator (Example: 66 Pine Street, NE). If the incident occurred in the roadway in front of the numbered house or business on that street, or an alley, etc., explain the precise location in the first sentence of the narrative.

09.19.8 CASE SUPPLEMENT REPORTS

- A. All follow-up information shall be documented in a case supplement report.
- B. Case supplement reports shall carry the same OCA as the incident report.

09.19.9 ARREST REPORT

- A. Arrest reports shall be completed when an arrest is made in any of the following ways:
 - 1. On-view;
 - 2. Order for arrest (OFA);
 - 3. Warrant for arrest;
 - 4. Citation when physical custody occurs such as DWI;
 - 5. Criminal Summons is served and there is no physical custody;
 - 6. Any NIBRS group A offense (see attachment #1).

09.19.10 REPORTABLE CRASHES

- A. Crashes reported to the NC Division of Motor Vehicles shall follow guidelines outlined in the Driver's Privacy Protection Act. Crash reports must be requested through the North Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) at https://www.ncdot.gov/dmv/downloads/Documents/TR-67A.pdf.
- B. The narrative of such reports to DMV shall include "Driver Number 1 states" and quote driver number 1. The narrative shall include "Driver number 2 states" and quote driver number 2. In the absence of independent evidence, the officer shall not offer an opinion of fault unless he or she also files a motor vehicle or criminal charge.

09.19.11 NON-REPORTABLE CRASHES

Any crash that is non-reportable may be handled by an insurance information exchange between the drivers involved, facilitated by the officer, unless either party requests a crash report to be completed.

09.19.12 REPORT SUBMISSION PROCEDURES

- A. In order to generate a report in RMS, a coworker shall be assigned to a call in the CAD system.
- B. Utilizing the reporting system, coworkers shall electronically generate the type of report they shall complete.
- C. Coworkers shall complete the mandatory fields for the respective form and save the report.
- D. Once the report has been completed, coworkers shall use the 'error check' function in the system. If necessary, coworkers shall correct any returned errors.
- E. After an error check has been completed, the coworker shall utilize the 'submit' function to electronically forward the report for supervisory review.

09.19.13 SUPERVISORY REVIEW PROCEDURES

Supervisors shall check reports for compliance with departmental reporting requirements, to include spelling and grammar. Reports shall be checked throughout the shift to provide time for an officer to fix any errors prior to the end of shift. Reports not approved shall be returned to the officer for correction.
