Law Enforcement Support Office

In the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) for Fiscal Years 1990 and 1991, Congress authorized the transfer of excess DoD property to federal, state and local law enforcement agencies. Through subsequent revisions, the NDAA for Fiscal Year 1997 established the Law Enforcement Support Office (LESO) Program to facilitate 10 § USC 2576a.

No equipment is purchased for distribution. All items were DoD excess equipment or had been held as part of reserve stocks until no longer needed.

Since inception, the program has transferred over \$7.6 Billion worth of equipment (based on the items Original Acquisition Value [OAV]). In Fiscal Year 2022, \$160 Million (based on OAV) worth of equipment was conditionally transferred to participating law enforcement agencies.

Items that are requested via the program include clothing, office supplies, tools, rescue equipment, vehicles, and small arms.

Since program inception, less than 2 percent of equipment transferred are small arms and less than 1 percent are tactical vehicles.

More than 8,800 law enforcement agencies have enrolled in the program.

Property Available



Rescue, Safety and Environmental Protection Equipment such as floodlights, tactical vehicles, watercraft, ATVs, snowmobiles, motorcycles, trailers and radios.



Tactical Equipment such as boots and many other individual tactical clothing and equipment.

Field gear such as cots, blankets, heaters, flahslights and generators to support agency operational readiness.



Exercise Equipment such as treadmills, ellipticals, weights, bikes and stationary bikes to maintain fitness standards.



Office Equipment such as copiers, fax machines, office furniture, cabinets, desks and computers.



Training and Support items such as microwaves, refrigerators, air conditioners, for agency operational readiness.

Medical Supplies Such as first aid dressing burn, hand sanitizer, individual first aid kit, universal first aid kit, tourniquet.
