Reciprocity of concealed handgun permits is for traveling or visiting only. A Colorado resident cannot legally carry concealed in-state using a non-resident permit issued by any other state.

STATUTE 18-12-213

Colorado will recognize a valid permit to carry a concealed handgun that was issued in a reciprocal state if the permit was issued to a resident of the state that issued the permit. The permit holder must have a valid driver's license or identification card issued from the same state that issued the permit. The permit holder must be 21 years of age or older. When you become a resident of the state of Colorado, you must apply for a Colorado Concealed Handgun Permit. Your valid permit issued from a reciprocal state will only be recognized for 90 days after the date your valid Colorado.

I've lost my permit, what do I do?

The Change of Address/Lost Permit/Name Change form can be located at epcsheriffsoffice.com. If you move OUT of the state of Colorado and become a resident of another state, your Colorado permit will no longer be valid.

STATUTE 18-12-210

Within 30 days after a permittee changes the address specified on his or her permit, the permittee shall notify the issuing Sheriff of the change of address.

Can I have a loaded or unloaded handgun in my vehicle with or without a permit?

Yes, per Statute 18-12-204: The handgun (pistol or revolver) can be anywhere in your vehicle and does not have to be visible.

What about driving in Colorado?

Yes, per Statute 18-12-105.6: You may travel with a handgun in your private vehicle while in Colorado counties, cities, and municipalities.

STATUTE 33-6-125

"It is unlawful for any person, except a person authorized by law or by the division, to possess or have under the person's control any firearm, other than a **pistol or revolver**, in or on any motor vehicle unless the chamber of the firearm is unloaded."

If contacted by law enforcement, do I need to notify the officer that I have a permit and in possession of a handgun?

No, per Statute 18-12-204(2)(a): You must carry your permit along with valid photo ID at all times when in possession of a concealed handgun and produce both documents upon demand of a law enforcement officer.

STATUTE 18-12-214 (1) (b)

"A peace officer may temporarily disarm a permittee, incident to a lawful stop of the permittee. The peace officer shall return the handgun to the permittee prior to discharging the permittee from the scene."

Am I eligible for a permit if I use medical or recreational marijuana?

No, per Statute 18-12-203(1)(f): The Sheriff cannot issue a permit to any applicant who is an unlawful user of or addicted to a controlled substance.

STATUTE 18-18-105 (5)

"Controlled substance means a drug, substance, or immediate precursor included in schedules 1 through V of part 2 of this article, including cocaine, marijuana, marijuana concentrate, cathinones, any synthetic cannabinoid, and salvia divinorum."

COMMONLY ASKED QUESTIONS

PROHIBITED CONCEALED CARRY LOCATIONS

STATUTE 18-12-214

(2) Anywhere prohibited by federal law.

(3) ...real property, or into any improvements erected thereon, of a public elementary, middle, junior high, or high school.

(4) ... a public building at which

(a) Security personnel and electronic weapons screening devices are permanently in place at each entrance to the building;

(b) Security personnel electronically screen each person who enters the building to determine whether the person is carrying a weapon of any kind; and

(c) Security personnel require each person who is carrying a weapon of any kind to leave the weapon in possession of security personnel while the person is in the building.

CONCEALED CARRY IN PARKS

City Parks: Yes, with a permit

State Parks: Yes, in designated areas. CSP Regulation Article IV 106(a)(1)

National Parks: Yes, must comply with State/Federal Regulations 16 USC 1a-7b

National Forest: Yes, must comply with State/Federal Regulations 36 CFR 261.10(d)

SECURE FIREARM STORAGE IN AN UNATTENDED VEHICLE

A person shall not knowingly leave a handgun in an unattended vehicle unless the handgun is in a locked hard-sided container that is placed out of plain view, including a locked container that is permanently affixed to the vehicle's interior. (For this section, a locked glove compartment or the locked center console of a vehicle is a locked hard-sided container.) Can I carry a concealed handgun on public school grounds if I am a permit holder?

No, per Statute 18-12-204: Carrying a weapon on your person on public school grounds is a felony in the state of Colorado.

STATUTE 18-12-214 (3) (a)

"A permittee may have a handgun on the real property of the public school so long as the handgun remains in her/her vehicle and if the permittee is not in the vehicle, the handgun is in a compartment within the vehicle and the vehicle is locked."

What about private colleges or universities?

Per Statute 18-12-105.5: If you wish to carry on a private campus, review their policies regarding firearms. Consult legal counsel with any specific questions.

Can I carry concealed in a restaurant, bar, or other private business establishment?

Yes, per Statute 18-12-214: However a person may not carry where a private property owner, tenant, employer, or business entity prohibits weapons.

STATUTE 18-12-106 (1) (d)

"A person commits a class 2 misdemeanor if: (d) The person has in his or her possession a firearm while the person is under the influence of intoxicating liquor or of a controlled substance."

What if there is a "No Display of Firearms" sign on a business or public building?

Yes: You may carry a concealed handgun unless other prohibitions apply.

Am I required to have my permit and my Colorado Drivers License/ID while carrying concealed?

Yes, per Statute 18-12-204(a): You must carry the permit, together with the valid photo ID at all times when in possession of a concealed handgun.
