A nonrefundable fee of \$374.00, for the initial license, must be submitted with the application, along with proof of a North Carolina Department of Revenue, and a written statement from the owner or lessee of the property where you propose to do business granting permission (if applicable). Prior to operation as an itinerant merchant, an itinerant merchant license must be obtained from the Police Department. The Itinerant Merchant License is valid for ninety (90) days from date of issuance. Upon expiration the applicant must submit a renewal application with a nonrefundable fee of \$219.00. The renewal license is valid for ninety (90) days from the date of issuance and may be renewed.
