A. PURPOSE. To establish the response and outline specific responsibilities to incidents involving water and boating accidents within the city of Grand Rapids

B. DEFINITIONS

- 1. *Water*. Any river, stream, creek, ditch, canal, gravel pit, public, or private pool, public or private pond, etc.
- 2. *Water Accident*. Any drowning, near-drowning, or any serious injury incurred in the waters of this state when a boat is **not** directly involved.
- 3. *Boating Accident*. Incident that involves a boat or its equipment, on the water, in which:
 - a. A person dies
 - b. A person disappears from the vessel under circumstances that indicate death or injury.
 - c. A person is injured and requires medical treatment beyond first aid.
 - d. Damage to the vessel and other property that is \$2,000 or more.
 - e. Includes electrical shock, and carbon monoxide poisoning.

C. SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES – WATER ACCIDENTS

- 1. The Grand Rapids Fire Department shall:
 - a. Initially respond to a water rescue emergency in a combined effort with the Police Department.
 - b. Supply specialized water rescue equipment and/or personnel.
 - c. Request body recovery operations, if necessary, from the Kent County Sheriff's Department.
- 2. The Kent County Sheriff's Department shall:
 - a. Supply all specialized body recovery personnel, boats and equipment.

- b. Complete recovery (dragging and diving) operations.
- 3. The Grand Rapids Police Department shall supply:
 - a. Shore personnel to take care of the complaint, family, witnesses, found property, and body upon recovery.
 - b. One-half of the total personnel needed during dragging operations.
 - c. All personnel needed for foot search operations along the bank.
 - d. Any additional personnel required to maintain scene security.
- 4. Responding Grand Rapids officer shall complete an Incident and Water Accident Report then forward them to the Traffic Unit.
- 5. Detective Unit personnel shall complete all follow up investigations.
- 6. Physicians have the responsibility, by law, to report serious water injuries to the police.
- 7. Traffic Unit will forward copies of the reports to the Kent County Sheriff Department Marine Unit.

D. SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES – BOATING ACCIDENTS

- 1. A vessel operator is responsible for reporting accidents to police.
- 2. The first responding officer shall:
 - a. Complete both an incident report and "Official Boating Accident Report."
 - b. Forward the "Official Boating Accident Report" to the Traffic Unit.
- 3. Traffic Unit Personnel shall:
 - a. Complete all follow-up investigations.

- b. Forward the "Official Boating Accident Report" to the Michigan DNR, Kent County Sheriff Department Marine Unit, and the Grand Rapids City Attorney, retaining a copy for records.
- E. The Watch Commander shall maintain a supply of "Official Boating Accident Report" and "Official Water Accident Report" forms.
