Georgetown Scott County Parks and Recreation Minutes

July 17, 2023 5:30pm

- 1) Call to Order and Roll Call; Ron Flannery called the July 17, 2023, Parks and Recreation Board meeting to order. Michael Johnson, Dt Wells, Temple Juett, Sharon Flynt, and Andrea Giusti were present.
- 2) Agenda: Kim Rice requested to amend the agenda by adding Cricket to the top of new business. Michael Johnson made the motion to accept the agenda seconded by DT Wells. The motion was unanimously approved.
- 3) Public Comments: Heather D'Hondt addressed the board about an incident at Marshall Park Fields.

4)Consent Agenda

- 1. Minutes: Michael Johnson made a motion to approve June 20, 2023, minutes seconded by Temple Juett. The motion was unanimously approved.
- 2. Bills: Michael Johnson made a motion to approve the bills seconded by DT Wells. The motion was unanimously approved.

5) Staff Reports

- 1. Bookkeeper: Vicki Miller informed the board that the current balance is 1,884,623.80 vs last year's 1,400,820.65. A financial statement was handed out.
- 2. Assistant Director: Ed Maynard gave the attendance report for June with the Pavilion at 13092, Ed Davis at 1089, and Suffoletta at 7061.
- 3. Facility Maintenance: Mike Short talked about the Aquatics Center security system and recommendations to change the DVR. Mike Short informed the board that two companies are giving us estimates on repairing or replacing the pool area doors and he would have quotes at the next board meeting.
- 4. Outdoor Maintenance: Larry Brandenburg thanked the Softball Club for all the work they have been doing at the Marshall Park Fields.
- 5. Director: Kim Rice
 - A. Actual to Budget-Delegated to Ed Maynard which is on his financial report.
 - B. Analyze Monthly Recovery-Delegated to Ed Maynard
 - C. Master Plan Update- There were tables at the fair and have had open houses at the Pavilion and Ed Davis and a presentation to the City Council. Future events include an Interlocal meeting at the library and then a meeting with the steering committee.
 - D. Employee Retention/Open Positions-We are training with Paycom on the new modules that support tracking and reporting of employees. DT Wells was wondering what incentives we offer to help retain employees and some suggestions were made.
 - E. AED-CPR Rec Coaches
 - F. Recreation Leagues We have developed an annual training with a timeline for organized sports. Six sports organizations were represented at the training and the topics covered were field scheduling through parks and deadlines for each of the scheduling periods based on the season.

- G. Delegated to Staff- Working on the development of the budget from the staff and giving them the parameters based on what the board has approved.
- H. CAPRA Accreditation We have 8% met and 50% in progress. We need to link some of our updates and it would raise that percentage.
- I. Policy Updates Lifeguard Uniform is 7 on Old Business.
- J. Fireworks Kim Rice informed the board how much Parks is involved in that event and the fair and doesn't get any of the recognition for the major roles the staff is responsible for completing.
- K. Patron Disciplinary -July 5th there was an issue with the use of Marshall Fields being prepared for a tournament and the use of the fields at that time deemed open play/public access. The police were called because of the behavior that escalated when the softball club was trying to access the fields to prep. The request for an appeal will be heard at the August 21st board meeting. Kim Rice would like the appeal review with the Recreation and Programming committee and that's scheduled for August 27th.
- L. Marshall Park Dugouts- We had a volunteer that offered to do the dugouts per approval of the specs and we haven't heard from him since so Kim Rice let the board know that parks would be taking that over and putting out a bid.
- M. Restaurant Tax Study- Kim Rice contacted Murray State, Dr. Simone Silva, Professor of Economics to begin gathering information to do a case study regarding the impact of a tax on Georgetown-Scott County for \$1000.00
- N. Capital Projects EDLC partition project is delegated to Ed Maynard and Tina Lilly. Infield ball field material will go out to bid in February. 15ft Batwing is delegated to Larry Brandenburg, Brooking Park basketball court is awaiting an updated quote from Musco and will be purchased through state contract pricing. Scoreboard replacements are delegated to Larry Brandenburg, Brooking Park tennis courts repairs will be put out to bid along with surfacing the basketball courts. The Pavilion slide restoration is delegated to Bryan Parker, Replacement of deck chairs and sound system at SFAC is delegated to Bryan Parker. Kim Rice asked the board to consider purchasing a retrofit Control Link for Lois Holmes Field whose estimated cost is \$17,875.
- O. Football Building-We got the drawings from the architect who said we need engineered drawings if we are putting it out to bid. Also considering if there needs to be a concession section added since they don't have one with water.
- P. Legacy Trail- A professional design firm has been selected and are awaiting the next notice to proceed.
- Q. VIP Implementation -We have begun training on the analytics module and management has received purchasing training. Waiting on them to import the access groups for purchasing and there working on our bank balances, outstanding checks, and balances for open PO's.
- R. Drawings of the Parks- Element is doing Lisle Rd Soccer Complex so we can load those images into Civic Rec to be able to schedule the fields. Bowman has been contracted to do ariel images for Brooking Park, Scott Co Parks, Robert Lonnie Suffoletta Park, Marshal Park, Lower, and Upper Great Crossing Park.
- S. County Employee Appreciation Event is August 4th and Parks will be providing a tent, sound system, and some activities.

- T. Pavilion Shutdown is from September 15th through the 24th. The only big project is slide repair and everything else is general cleaning and maintenance.
- U. Staff Retreat near Cave Run in a cabin Sept. 29th through 31st for training and team building. The approval is to allow the IRS per diem rate for expenses for food.

DT Wells made a motion to move the new business in front of the old business seconded by Andrea Giusti. The motion was unanimously approved.

7) New Business

- Cricket- Hitesh Sheth asked the board to approve a storage building to be placed at Scott Co Park for Cricket along with digging and pouring concrete for poles for a net backstop. The board asked Mr. Hitesh to come back in August with a plan and location for both items requested.
- 2. Farm Machinery Date Request-Mr. Wallace requested the use of the Concession Building, enclosed barn, open barn, pulling track, and horse show ring for July 19th 20th for 2024 and July 18th and 19th for 2025 for their Antique Farm Show. Mr. Wallace asked the board to allow them to use the area on Thursday before and Sunday after the show for prepping and cleaning up after the event. Dt Wells made a motion to allow the dates with the extra days at no cost and a change to the policy to allow reciprocal dates without coming to the board every two years seconded by Sharon Flynt. The motion was unanimously approved.
- Quarterly Report-Courtlyn Ledesma handed out a report for the second quarter which showed increases in reach on Facebook and the website. Courtlyn Ledesma also informed the board of events that had taken place in the second quarter and some upcoming projects.
- 4. Paygrade Adjustment-Kim Rice asked the board to approve a pay grade adjustment based on a change in the city's scale which increased and left some employees under the minimum pay for their grades. Michael Johnson made a motion to accept the new pay increase presented with a caveat for a report next month, seconded by Temple Juett. The motion was unanimously approved.

6) Old Business

- 1. Skate Park Bid- Mike Short let the board know that we received no bids for the repair of the skate park. The jailer has promised some inmates to help with tearing out the old wood next week.
- 2. AEDS- Bryan Parker waiting on a response from Georgetown Community Hospital and will call them tomorrow.
- 3. Royal Spring Decks- Larry Brandenburg told the board that the decks have been put back out to bid.
- 4. Mowing Bid-Larry Brandenburg informed the board that the mowing is back out for bids with modifications that were needed.
- 5. Civic Rec Update- Ed Maynard let the board know that Civic Rec went live July 1 and are working through some of the issues.
- 6. Employee Wages-Ed Maynard readdressed the request from employees in June for an increase in pay and changing the Pavilion operational hours to be table August board meeting.
- 7. Lifeguard Uniform Policy-Kim Rice presented policy updates regarding proper dress and attire. Dt Wells made a motion to accept the policies as presented seconded by Michael Johnson. The motion was unanimously approved.

- 11) Board member comments- DT Wells asked about paying league directors, and Kim Rice has asked parks professional organizations and found out they are either volunteer or full-time employees.
- 12) Adjournment Temple Juett made a motion to adjourn seconded by Andrea Giusti. The motion was unanimously approved.

13) Resolutions:

Res#24-001 Approved Antique Farm Machinery to book out the Brooking Park buildings, pulling track and show ring for July 18-21 2024, and July 17-20 2025, and to only be charged for the Friday and Saturday. And change the policy to allow reciprocal dates so they don't have to come to the board every two years.

Res#24-002 Approved a pay grade adjustment based on a change with the cities pay scale which had some employees not at the minimum for their grade.

Introduction

This report presents preliminary estimates of the potential tax revenue if a 1% - 3% sales tax is implemented on restaurants in Scott County and Georgetown, Kentucky. For that purpose, information on the current restaurant sales and their demand price elasticity is required. A series of assumptions are made such as to avoid overestimating the results. The following section presents the sources of data on restaurant sales. Next, data sources regarding restaurant sales' elasticity are presented. The final section presents the results and concludes.

Estimates of Restaurant Sales

The first step is to estimate the current sales of restaurants in Scott County and Georgetown. All types of restaurants were included, including full-service, limited-service, and all other food and drinking places. The list contains all establishments whose NAICS classification is 722 - Food Services and Drinking Places, and it is also called here FAFH — Food away from home.

The data source used for this report is ESRI*. The information on employment, number of businesses, and sales is presented in Table 1.

Estimates of the Elasticities

The next step is to obtain the sector's price elasticity of demand, which indicates the predicted percentage fall in sales given each 1% increase in price. Estimates obtained according to different studies are presented in Table 2. This report uses the elasticity suggested by the USDA (Okrent & Alston, 2012). That is, for each 1% increase in price, sales are expected to fall 0.71%. This study adopts the view that it is best to have a conservative estimate than to risk exaggerating the effects (Neill, 2013; Kashian et al., 2021). However, even though the USDA estimate is not the lowest, it is close to the lowest and is substantially more recent.

Results

The final effect of the tax on equilibrium prices and quantities can only be obtained if both the price elasticities of demand and supply are known. However, estimates of supply elasticity for the sector are less readily available. Therefore, the following drastic scenario is assumed: the supply is perfectly elastic, implying that the tax burden falls entirely on consumers and that the equilibrium quantity falls by the whole amount predicted by the elasticity of demand. In reality, tax incurrence is shared by consumers and producers and the equilibrium quantity does not fall as much. ² Nevertheless, this assumption not only makes estimating the tax revenue feasible but is also conservative: given the finite demand elasticity, a perfectly elastic supply maximizes the fall in equilibrium quantity.

Given these assumptions, the tax revenue can be estimated by multiplying the value of sales (Table 1) by the predicted reduction in quantity given the elasticity of demand times the tax rate. The results are presented in Table 3. Three tax rates vary from 1% to 3% of sales revenue.

1 Executive Summary

2023 Georgetown-Scott County Parks and Recreation Survey Executive Summary

Overview

ETC Institute administered a parks and recreation survey for Georgetown-Scott Parks and Recreation during spring and summer months of 2023. The survey will help the Georgetown-Scott County Parks and Recreation Board determine park and recreation priorities for the community.

Methodology

ETC Institute mailed a survey packet to a random sample of households in Georgetown-Scott County. Each survey packet contained a cover letter, a copy of the survey, and a postage-paid return envelope. Residents who received the survey were given the option of returning the survey by mail or completing it online at GSCParkSurvey.org.

After the surveys were mailed, ETC Institute followed up with residents to encourage participation. To prevent people who were not residents of Georgetown-Scott County from participating, everyone who completed the survey online was required to enter their home address prior to submitting the survey. ETC Institute then matched the addresses that were entered online with the addresses that were originally selected for the random sample. If the address from a survey completed online did not match one of the addresses selected for the sample, the online survey was not included in the final database for this report.

The goal was to complete a minimum of 500 completed surveys from residents. The goal was met with 503 completed surveys collected. The overall results for the sample of 503 households have a precision of at least +/-4.3 at the 95% level of confidence.

Georgetown-Scott Parks and Facilities

Use of Facilities: Respondents were asked to indicate how often their household had visited any Georgetown-Scott County parks or facilities in the past year. Respondents most often said they visited 20 times or more (42%) followed by 24% indicating they visited between 1-5 times. The parks and facilities most often visited were Brooking Park (66%), The Pavilion (52%), and Lower Great Crossing Park (39%). Overall, most respondents (70%) rated the condition of parks and facilities as either good (54%) or excellent (16%).

Facility Types. Respondents were asked to select all the types of facilities their household currently uses or would like to use. Trails (walking/hiking) (60%), natural areas/nature parks (57%), picnic shelters (45%), outdoor swimming pools (45%), and large community parks (45%) were most often selected.

Investment in Facilities. Respondents asked to identify what type of investment they would like to see in facilities: revitalization/upgrades to existing, new development, both upgrades and new development, or no investment. The highest percentage of respondents wanted some sort of investment in an outdoor stage or amphitheater (98%), outdoor fitness equipment/obstacle course (97%), a nature center (97%), spray pads (97%), and special needs facilities (97%). The top four facilities chosen as most important to households were walking/hiking trails (35%), natural areas (28%), outdoor swimming pools (21%), and playgrounds (19%). If respondents had \$100 to allocate among types of parks and recreation facilities, respondents put the greatest amount of funding (\$23.26) into improvements/maintenance of existing parks, playgrounds, and picnic areas followed by the development of walking and biking trails (\$19.90) and the acquisition of land for open space/green space (\$13.56%). Most respondents (61%) either moderately support (44%) or strongly support (17%) a tax to fund the development and operations of parks and recreation.

Improvements to Parks and Facilities. Respondents were asked to select all the types of improvements they would like to see at Georgetown and Scott County parks. Respondents most requested improvements to restrooms (66%) followed by natural areas (38%) and picnic tables/benches (36%).

Georgetown-Scott Parks and Recreation Programs

Participation in Programs. Twenty-seven percent (27%) of respondents said they had participated in recreational programs offered by Georgetown-Scott County Parks and Recreation Department over the past year. Of those who had participated, most (75%) rated these programs as either good (57%) or excellent (18%). Respondents said they would be more encouraged to participate in offerings by parks and recreation with the addition of desired programs (38%), more/improved restrooms (38%), or improvements of existing facilities (38%).

Importance of Services. Respondents were asked to rate the importance of nine functions that could be performed by Georgetown-Scott County Parks and Recreation Department. Respondents thought it was most important (rating "somewhat important" or "very important") Georgetown-Scott Parks and Recreation Department operates and maintains parks and facilities (98%), provides programs for residents of all ages and families (96%), and preserves the environment and provides green space (94%). These were also the three functions most important to respondents. Each of the nine functions received mostly important ratings.

Organizations Used. Respondents were asked to select all the organizations their household uses for parks and recreation programs and facilities. Respondents most often use Georgetown-Scott County Parks and Recreation (55%) followed by neighboring cities/counties/state parks (27%) or organized sports organizations (24%).


Program Investments. Respondents were asked to select all the types of programs their household currently uses or would like to use if available. Festivals (51%), fishing/canoeing/boating (40%), adult fitness and wellness programs (38%), and concerts/art performances (38%) were the most often selected programs. Respondents were then asked to identify what type of investment they would like to see in those programs: revitalization/upgrades to existing, new development, both, or no investment. The highest percentage of respondents wanted some sort of investment in a adult art and performing arts (99%), adult classes (99%), and concerts/art performances (98%). The top four programs chosen as most important to households were festivals (31%), adult classes (28%), concerts/art performances (24%), and fishing/canoeing/boating (23%).

Communication Methods. Respondents were asked to select all of the ways they prefer to learn about programs and activities. Respondents most prefer communication via social networking (65%), the parks and recreation website (58%), or email (42%).












Q5a. How would you rate the quality of these programs?

by percentage of respondents who answered "Yes" to Q5


















Use of Recreation Programs

by percentage of respondents




Georgetown-Scott County Parks and Recreation 2023 Survey







