**I. STATEWIDE FINGERPRINT RECORDS SYSTEM**

The Code of Laws of South Carolina. Section 23-3-110, 120 and 130 establishes a statewide criminal information system, designates the State Law Enforcement Division (SLED) as the official repository for all criminal records and authorizes SLED to promulgate rules regarding the type information to be provided. SLED also operates the Automated Fingerprint Information System (AFIS). It is the policy of the Greer Police Department to send fingerprints of all arrested subjects to SLED and to comply with all SLED regulations.

**II. STATEWIDE CRIMINAL INFORMATION SYSTEM**

The State Law Enforcement Division (SLED) maintains a statewide centralized criminal information system. Access to this system is through the SLED terminal in the Communications Section and MDT terminals. As required by the South Carolina Code of Laws as cited in Section I of this policy, the Greer Police Department participates in this system.

**III. STATEWIDE CRIME REPORTING SYSTEM**

SLED is the controlling state agency for the statewide crime reporting system. The Greer Police Department participates in this system by submitting all required reports, statistics or other information to SLED.

**IV. SLED/NCIC**

The Communications Section is equipped with a terminal and some vehicles are equipped with MDTs that provide Police Department access to SLED, NCIC, NLETS and the South Carolina Highway Department's Motor Vehicle registration and drivers' license information. These terminals will be utilized in accordance with provisions outlined in the SLED and NCIC manuals.

**V. SCDMV Member Services**

Information obtained from SCDMV Member Services will be used for official business of the City of Greer only. Employees registered with the SCDMV are the only persons allowed to access the SCDMV Member Services. Registered employees are not permitted to share their password with anyone and are responsible for any inquiries and the use of information obtained by such inquiries obtained through their password.
