BREATH ANALYSIS TESTING

- 1. PURPOSE: To establish procedures for conducting breath analysis testing in driving under the influence (DUI) cases utilizing a device approved and installed by the Alabama Department of Forensic Sciences.
- 2. POLICY: It shall be the policy of the Huntsville Police Department to administer breath analysis tests to DUI suspects in accordance with Alabama Motor Vehicle Laws, Chapter 5A, Section 194.
- 3. SCOPE: This Written Directive is applicable to all sworn personnel who are authorized to utilize the breath testing instrument for testing DUI arrestees.
- 4. RESPONSIBILITY: It shall be the responsibility of all affected personnel to comply with the directives established in this Written Directive.
- 5. PROCEDURES: It shall be the responsibility of all breath testing operators to comply with these procedures.
 - A. Breath testing operators are responsible for the following:
 - 1. Understanding the rules and regulations covering the chemical test for intoxication program, including relevant state statutes.
 - 2. Ensuring the required 20-minute deprivation period is observed.
 - 3. Checking the dry gas cylinder gauges are in the operating range and that the printer is stocked with paper.
 - 4. Completely collecting and entering all demographic and other required information.
 - 5. Recognizing error codes given by the instrument and to know the proper response.
 - 6. Testifying to the testing procedure in court.
 - 7. Maintaining instrument operator certification.
 - 8. Breath testing operators shall routinely inspect the breath testing instrument prior to administering a test. Routine inspections of the instrument are intended to identify:
 - a. Instrument malfunctions;
 - b. Misuse or mistreatment of the instrument;
 - c. Ordinary wear and tear of the instrument which will require maintenance; and

- d. Supplies which need to be replenished.
- 9. Breath testing instrument operators shall report deficiencies noted during routine inspections of the instrument to the Deputy Chief of Operations, via chain of command.

NOTE: Any mechanical malfunctions should be reported to the Alabama Department of Forensic Sciences by calling 205-620-0399 during regular business hours or leaving a voicemail at 205-260-8722 after hours.

- B. The Deputy Chief of Operations or designee shall ensure that all breath testing instruments used by the Huntsville Police Department are operational.
- 6. CERTIFICATION: Sworn personnel who administer breath tests to DUI suspects must be certified through the Department of Forensic Sciences. Re-certification shall be required for sworn operators on a yearly basis, to be scheduled by the Department of Forensic Sciences. Certification records are maintained by the Department of Forensic Science.
