## **PURPOSE:**

- To establish a unified process for identifying, assessing, and reporting:
  - Suspected or confirmed abuse, neglect, exploitation, or molestation;
  - Self-harm, suicidal ideation, or mental health crises;
  - Threats to staff safety during home visits or interactions with patients;
- To ensure mandated reporting and safety process maintains compliance with state and federal reporting requirements and protects the rights and well-being of patients and staff.

## **DEFINITIONS**:

- Abuse: Physical, sexual, emotional, or verbal mistreatment.
- Neglect: Failure to provide necessary care, supervision, or services.
- Exploitation: Improper use of a patient's resources or vulnerability.
- <u>Self-Harm/Suicidal Ideation</u>: Verbal, written, or behavioral indicators of intent or thoughts to harm oneself.
- <u>Hostile or Unsafe Behavior</u>: Actions, threats, or statements that make a nurse feel unsafe during service provision.

## **POLICY:**

- The Agency and its representatives are committed to:
  - o Protecting patients from abuse, neglect, exploitation, and self-harm;
  - Maintaining a safe environment for all staff during service delivery;
  - Meeting all mandated reporting responsibilities across all states of operation;
  - Encouraging early identification and intervention in situations that may escalate to violence or self-harm.

- Healthcare professionals and other mandated reporters shall not be held liable for good-faith reporting, and may face civil or criminal penalties for failing to report.
- The Agency recognizes that there can be no guarantee of the patient's protection from neglect, exploitation, or abuse because abuse is generally intermittent and Agency services account for a minimal amount of time and interaction between Agency staff and family in the home environment.

## **PROCEDURE:**

## Initial and Ongoing Assessment

Upon admission and during ongoing care, the nurse will assess for risk factors of abuse, neglect, or self-harm. Risk indicators will be documented in the patient's chart.

# Identification and Response

#### If a patient:

- Expresses suicidal ideation;
- o Appears to be under the influence and is making threatening or irrational statements;
- Admits to or shows signs of abuse, neglect, or exploitation;
- Makes the nurse feel unsafe;

#### The nurse should:

- Maintain professional distance and de-escalate as needed;
- Leave the residence if personal safety is at risk;
- Contact 911 for immediate danger;
- Contact the Clinical Supervisor to report the event.

#### Documentation

The nurse must document what was said or observed, the questions asked, and answers received, any action taken (911 call, exit, APS/CPS contact), and notification to the pharmacy or care team (if applicable).

# Reporting

The Clinical Supervisor, Director of Nursing, or Agency Director is responsible for ensuring timely reporting to:

- o Adult or Child Protective Services (APS/CPS);
- o Local crisis services or 988 for suicidal ideation;
- Law enforcement, if necessary;
- o The contracting pharmacy & ordering provider with respect for HIPAA and safety.

## Staff Training

All clinical staff will receive training at hire and annually:

- o On recognizing signs of abuse, neglect, exploitation, and self-harm;
- o On mandated reporting laws and procedures in each service state;
- o On nurse safety and de-escalation strategies in the home.

# • Legal Protections

Mandated reporters are immune from liability for good faith reports.

- o Failure to report can result in civil or criminal penalties.
- Non-mandated reporters are encouraged to report and also receive liability protection, unless reports are made maliciously.
