### How do I apply?

Referral or application for Vocational Rehabilitation Services can occur by contacting any of the area offices located throughout the state or by visiting the Vocational Rehabilitation website. Vocational Rehabilitation Services serves all Iowa high schools and can receive referrals or applications from school staff.

### **Am I eligible?**

Are you having difficulty getting or keeping a job due to a disability? Our professional counselors and staff are qualified to assess your eligibility for services and help you identify occupations, community organizations and resources you need to meet your employment goals.

# If I am in high school, can I participate in services?

If you are a high school student with a disability, Vocational Rehabilitation Services, in collaboration with high school teachers and community partners, can provide you with Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS). Pre-ETS provides opportunities for students to learn about career and training options as well as build work and self-advocacy skills. If you need specialized rehabilitation services in order to transition to job training and/or work after high school, you will be encouraged to apply for Vocational Rehabilitation Services and we'll continue to help you on your employment journey.

The vocational rehabilitation program in lowa is funded with 78.7% federal funds in the amount of \$29,923,186 for FFY2022. No non-governmental funds are used to finance this program.
