How do I apply?

Referral or application for Vocational Rehabilitation Services can occur by contacting any of the area offices located throughout the state or by visiting the Vocational Rehabilitation website. Vocational Rehabilitation Services serves all Iowa high schools and can receive referrals or applications from school staff.

Am I eligible?

Are you having difficulty getting or keeping a job due to a disability? Our professional counselors and staff are qualified to assess your eligibility for services and help you identify occupations, community organizations and resources you need to meet your employment goals.

If I am in high school, can I participate in services?

If you are a high school student with a disability, Vocational Rehabilitation Services, in collaboration with high school teachers and community partners, can provide you with Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS). Pre-ETS provides opportunities for students to learn about career and training options as well as build work and self-advocacy skills. Pre-ETS can be provided prior to application. If you need individualized rehabilitation services in order to transition to job training and/or work, you will be encouraged to apply for Vocational Rehabilitation Services.

Employment is the objective for each individual served by Vocational Rehabilitation Services. Eligible Iowans receive counseling and guidance in choosing a vocational goal consistent with their interests and abilities. An employment plan is jointly developed by the individual and the rehabilitation counselor that summarizes the individual's job goal, services needed to achieve employment, how they will be obtained, and ultimately how progress will be measured.

A network of resources to support your efforts

By partnering with your Vocational Rehabilitation counselor, you'll be connected with various public and private services and resources that can help you reach your employment goal. These include:

- Secondary and post-secondary institutions to coordinate academic and vocational training opportunities.
- A network of community rehabilitation programs that may assist you with employment preparation, job search, job placement and on-the-job support.
- Various workforce programs that will support your pathway.
- Employers to ensure a solid employee/employer relationship once you find a job.

Each individual requires various resources to be successfully employed. That is why Vocational Rehabilitation develops strong relationships with organizations across Iowa that can assist us in delivering on our mission—finding solutions and generating successful employment.

Employment First

IVRS supports the philosophy that employment is the first priority and preferred outcome for people with disabilities and the belief that all Iowans, including individuals with significant disabilities, are capable of full participation in integrated employment and community life.

Iowa Workforce Development Business Engagement Partnership

Vocational Rehabilitation Services is a division of Iowa Workforce Development. Vocational Rehabilitation works closely with Iowa Workforce Development's Business Engagement Division to learn the needs of disability-friendly employers to fully support you on the job. Some of the services provided by the Business Engagement Division include:

- Job analysis

Social Security and Supplemental Security Income

If you receive Social Security disability benefits and want to work, your Vocational Rehabilitation counselor will help you understand how work income will impact your benefits and guide you in developing a strategic approach to managing changes to your disability benefits.

Iowa's Vocational Rehabilitation program is supported by the U.S. Department of Education. 78.7% of the program is traditionally provided by federal funds. For Federal Fiscal Year 2025, a total of \$34,060,986, of the program is financed with federal funds, and \$6,245,238 is funded by the State of Iowa.
