Year #1

Semester 1/fall:

- Employment Seminar I (3 credits)
- Skills for the Social Setting (3 credits)

Total 6 credits at \$79.84 per credit hour = \$479.04 semester 1

Semester 2/spring:

- Employment Seminar II (3 credits)
- Leadership + Self Determination (3 credits)

Total 6 credits at \$79.84 per credit hour = \$479.04 semester 2

Year #1 Total = \$958.02 for 12 credit hours

Year #2

Semester 3/fall:

- Transition to Independent Living (3 credits)

Total 3 credits at \$79.84 per credit hour = \$239.52 semester 3

Semester 4/spring:

- Employment Internship (3 credits)
- Self Determination + Disability Awareness (3 credits)

Authorization Guidance:

- Authorize one term at a time
- Electives must be directly tied to JC's IPE & career goal
- Repeated electives may not be funded more than once without supervisor's approval
- Audited courses must be preapproved by the supervisor before approval of funding
- Students taking courses applicable toward degree track must obtain approval via ETP if taken simultaneously with CEEP programming and will follow post-secondary education process and funding
