JACKSONVILLE STATE UNIVERSITY BOARD OF TRUSTEES MINUTES

The Board of Trustees of JACKSONVILLE STATE UNIVERSITY held its Winter meeting in Jacksonville, Alabama on Monday, January 25, 2016 at 1:00 p.m. CDT.

Mr. Jim Bennett, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, called the meeting to order and asked that President John M. Beehler open the meeting with an invocation.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Chairman Bennett asked that the minutes of the October 19, 2015 Board of Trustees Annual meeting and the December 5, 2015 Emergency meeting be reviewed.

Mr. Thomas Dedrick made a motion to approve the October 19, 2015 Board of Trustees Annual meeting minutes as written. Mr. Ronnie Smith seconded the motion and the minutes were approved unanimously.

Senator Vivian Figures made a motion to approve the December 5, 2015 Board of Trustees Emergency meeting minutes as written. Mr. Clarence Daugette seconded the motion and the minutes were approved unanimously.

Chairman Bennett stated that he hoped everyone liked the new committee setup. He stated that he thought the new format for the Board meetings went well and allowed everyone to have greater participation in the process.

BUILDING AND FINANCE COMMITTEE

Mr. Ronnie Smith, Chair of the Building and Finance Committee, stated that the committee did not have any actionable items at this time; however, he stated that a copy of the 2014-15 Unaudited Annual Financial Report was placed in the binders for the Trustees to review. He stated that if anyone had any questions about the financial statements they could call him or Mr. Don Thacker, Interim Vice President for Administrative and Business Affairs and Interim Director of Internal Audit.

Mr. Smith told the Board that the bond refunding that was done in December 2015 netted the University a little over \$1.3 million dollars. The Building and Finance Committee has requested that the President move forward with another bond refunding that will net approximately \$1 million dollars. The funds that were gained from these refunding opportunities can only be used for capital projects. Mr. Smith asked that President Beehler and his staff set priorities for improvements that are needed on campus and begin to move forward on these projects.

ADVANCEMENT COMMITTEE

Mr. Randy Jones announced that a new Advancement Committee has been established. He will serve as Chair of the Committee, with Mr. Jim Coxwell serving as Vice Chair. Other members are Mr. Randy Owen, Ms. Gale Saxon Main, and Mr. Tony Ingram. He stated the following as the purpose of the Advancement Committee:

The Advancement Committee of the Board of Trustees at Jacksonville State University provides strategic input for the fundraising, marketing and communications, and alumni relations initiatives of the university. In so doing, the committee will:

- Review and approve the strategic initiatives and goals of the university advancement division.
- Review and recommend policy changes relating to the university advancement program when necessary.
- Monitor and measure the effectiveness of the university advancement programs.
- Assist in ensuring that programming and budgetary support is sufficient to advance the university's mission through the work of the university advancement division.

ACADEMIC AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

Mr. Clarence Daugette, Vice Chair of the Academic Affairs Committee, stated that there were no actionable items from the Committee at this time; however, the Committee met with several department heads and were brought up to date on what is going on at the University and within their individual departments. The Academic Affairs Committee was also introduced to the new Director of the International House, Chandni Khadka. Mr. Daugette welcomed Ms. Khadka to JSU.

ATHLETIC COMMITTEE

Mr. Thomas Dedrick, Chair of the Athletic Committee, stated that the Athletic Committee met, but did not have any actionable items to bring before the Board. He thanked Mr. Jim Coxwell for his past leadership of the Athletic Committee and the continued support that he provides.

Mr. Dedrick recognized all JSU athletes for their academic success. He said he is extremely proud of the fact that our student athletes have a 3.1 GPA overall.

Chairman Bennett welcomed Dr. Pamela Beehler, JSU's First Lady, to the Board of Trustees meeting.

Chairman Bennett welcomed Dr. Windon Edge, President of the Faculty Senate, to the Board of Trustees meeting. Dr. Edge stated that in the last Faculty Senate meeting there was a report from the committee that is currently reviewing JSU's promotion and tenure policy and trying to clarify a few things within it. Dr. Edge thanked Dr. Cynthia Connor, Assistant Professor of Education, who is currently in the process of going through all Faculty Senate records dating back to the seventies and putting them in a searchable electronic form. Dr. Edge invited everyone to attend the Grand Opening of the College of Nursing's Simulation Lab at Brookstone on January 25th at 5:00 p.m.

Chairman Bennett welcomed Mr. Tyler Brown, SGA President to the Board of Trustees meeting. Mr. Brown stated that JSU will begin recycling plastic and mixed paper products in Meehan Hall, Bibb Graves Hall, Martin Hall, Theron Montgomery Building, Houston Cole Library, and Brewer Hall. The Office of Student Life distributed 1,689 tickets to the student body for the first playoff game which was held at JSU Stadium, 2,488 for the quarter-final game and 1,783 for the semi-final game for a total of 5,960 student tickets provided by the President's Office. He thanked President Beehler for providing these tickets to our students.

STUDENT AFFAIRS

Enrollment

- As of January 11, 2016 there are 4,424 admissions applications submitted for the Fall of 2016 (4,139 first time freshmen) and (295 transfer). This represents a 125% increase in first time freshmen applications and a 79% increase in transfer applications compared to the same date last year.
- From September 2015 to December 2015, over 1,000 prospective students participated in a campus tour.
- Dual enrollment for Spring 2016 is 468, a 68% increase in participation from Spring 2015.

· University Registrar

There were 530 graduates for Fall semester 2015.

University Housing

The Spring 2016 total occupancy is 84.3% (Spring 2015 – 86%)

University Recreation

- University Recreation hosted the Calhoun County Basketball Tournament January 16-23rd and will host the Northeast Alabama Regional Basketball Tournament February 18-24th at Pete Mathews Coliseum.
- With the addition of the weight room at Stephenson Hall, use of the facilities and participation in fitness programs continue to increase. A new recreation facility would enhance options for our students and aid in both recruitment and retention.

Senior Olivia Drapes was an All-OVC first team selection, while freshman Claire Petersen earned a spot on the All-OVC second team and All-Newcomer team. It marks the first time since 2008 that JSU has been represented on the All-OVC first team.

Beach Volleyball

 The Gamecocks have begun spring practice and will be preparing for their first season of Beach Volleyball in the coming weeks. JSU will use its Spring Break to travel to Charleston, S.C., for several matches and will then play matches at UAB in Birmingham to make up its first Beach Volleyball schedule.

Softball

The Gamecock Softball team is gearing up for the 2016 season and will open things up on Feb. 7 with its annual Fan Day at 2 p.m. at University Field. The Gamecocks will host 12 home dates this season, starting with a visit from Alabama on Wednesday, March 2nd at 5 p.m.

Now therefore be it resolved that the Board of Trustees of Jacksonville State University declares that a suitable classroom in the College of Commerce and Business Administration be designated in honor of NobleBank & Trust and Ronnie Smith.

Now therefore be it further resolved that the entire Jacksonville State University family extends its thanks and gratitude to NobleBank &Trust and Ronnie Smith for their generosity to Jacksonville State University and to the College of Commerce and Business Administration.
