We recently lost a member of our KDOC family through a tragic incident in Larned last weekend. Shala Smith, a long-time employee at Larned Correctional Mental Health Facility, and her young son, Carver were victims of an apparent double-homicide and suicide. Shala began her career at LCMHF in November 2003, was promoted to Program Provider in October 2017 and then to Corrections Counselor II in June 2020. She was a bright, energetic professional who was committed to making a difference in the lives of those she worked with. Please join me in lending your thoughts and prayers to Shala's family, friends and all those at LCMHF during this difficult time.

On Monday, January 17, 2022, our nation will pause to observe Martin Luther King Day. Authorized through legislation signed by President Ronald Regan in 1983, this day commemorates the life and achievements of Martin Luther King, Jr. Dr. King led the fight for equity in the 50s and 60s before his assassination on March 29, 1968. His life and this day remind us all of the responsibility we have to confront injustice and speak up for others.
