I. STATEMENT OF POLICY

Intentional Program Violation (IPV) occurs when a client, for the purpose of establishing or maintaining eligibility or for increasing or preventing a reduction in benefits, intentionally:

- Makes a false or misleading statement, or misrepresents, conceals, or withholds facts, or
- Commits an act intended to mislead or misrepresent, conceal or withholds facts, or
- Commits any act that is a violation of the Food Stamp Act, LaCAP policy, or any state statute relating to the use, transfer, acquisition, receipt or possession of the Louisiana Purchase
 <u>* Electronic</u> Benefit Card.

If an individual receiving LaCAP is incarcerated or has an IPV from another state, the individual is not eligible for LaCAP. **

K-1231-LaCAP HOW IPV IS ESTABLISHED

Individuals may be found to have committed IPV:

- Through an administrative disqualification hearing,
- By signing a waiver of right to an administrative disqualification hearing,
- By a court of appropriate jurisdiction, or
- By a disqualification consent agreement in cases referred for prosecution.
