## **Purpose**

This policy describes <u>commercial motor vehicle (CMV) enforcement</u> and <u>operating a school bus without insurance.</u>

## **Definitions**

- <u>Disqualification</u> A notation on a driver's license record that prohibits an individual from operating a commercial motor vehicle (CMV) during a specified period.
- <u>Suspension</u> A notation on the driving record that blocks all driving privileges, regardless of the type
  of vehicle being operated.

# Commercial Motor Vehicle (CMV) Enforcement

### **General:**

- Driving privileges may be disqualified if a driver has any violation listed below while operating commercial motor vehicle (CMV) and/or holding a commercial driver's license (CDL) or commercial license's permit (CLP).
- All violations shall be submitted timely by the court to the Office of Motor Vehicles (OMV), so that the violations may be posted to the record within ten (10) days of conviction.
- The following does not apply to the disqualification for CMV Violations/Convictions and/or CDL or CLP holders:
  - o Article 894
  - o Article 691
  - o Article 892.1
  - o Article 893
  - Act 605
  - Pre-Trial Diversion/Intervention

- Imminent Hazard (FMCSA 383.52, R.S. 32:414.2) Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) will notify OMV when an imminent hazard violation is to be placed on the driver's record. The violation is immediately added to the driver's record which disqualifies the driver for an indefinite period and will not be reinstated until FMCSA notifies OMV. The individual must contact FMCSA at (404) 327-7348 to clear the violation prior to being able to reinstate with OMV.
  - There is no reinstatement fee.
- **Drug and Alcohol Clearinghouse Violation** The Drug and Alcohol Clearinghouse portal is checked daily and the violation is added to a record if a driver is prohibited.
  - o The driver is disqualified until no longer prohibited at the Clearinghouse.
  - o There is no reinstatement fee.
- Hardship A hardship cannot be issued for a commercial driver's license.

Endorsement	Penalties Due to Violation(s)	
	If you received a second conviction of any combination of reckless and/or	
HAZMAT (H)	negligent violations, the HAZMAT (H) endorsement will be permanently revoked.	
	Once the HAZMAT endorsement is removed, it cannot be added back in Louisiana.	
	If you received a second conviction of any combination of reckless and/or	
Combined Tank and HAZMAT (X)	negligent violations, the combined tank ad HAZMAT (X) endorsement will be	
Combined Tank and HAZIVIAT (X)	permanently revoked. The driver may, however, keep the tank (N) endorsement.	
	Once the HAZMAT endorsement is removed, it cannot be added back in Louisiana.	
School Bus (S)	If you received a DWI or Refusal while operating any vehicle, the (S) endorsement

- If both a suspension and a disqualification (for the same violation) are imposed, only one reinstatement fee shall be collected.
- The reinstatement fee is to be collected, as follows:
  - o If **disqualified only**, at the end of the disqualification period.
  - o If **suspended and disqualified**, at the end of the suspension period even if the disqualification is still in effect.
  - o If downgraded to a (Class D or E) and eligible for a hardship license, at the time the hardship license is issued.
  - o If **disqualified only and down-grading**, at the end of the disqualification period.

# Operating a School Bus without Insurance

## **Authority:**

### General:

Any school bus driver knowingly operating a school bus and any owner of a school bus allowing it to be
operated when such school bus is not covered by the required security shall, upon conviction, have his
commercial driver's license privileges disqualified for one year (365 days) and the registration of the
vehicle shall revoked for sixty (60) days.

## Requirements:

 The uninsured school bus must have been involved in an accident and the owner must have been convicted.

### Fees:

• There is no reinstatement fee required for this violation.

#### Notes:

• This is a state disqualification and will not count as a major, serious or any other FMCSA violation. There are no provisions in the law to allow for a hardship license.
