

# Commercial Driver License

## Classifications, Endorsements & Restrictions

All Florida Commercial Driver License (CDL) applicants must schedule an appointment at [taxcollector.com](http://taxcollector.com) and complete a [Driver License application](#).

Classifications	
<b>A</b>	Combination vehicle with a combined GVWR of 26,001 pounds or more AND the GVWR of the vehicle(s) towed is OVER 10,000 pounds
<b>B</b>	Single vehicle with a GVWR of 26,001 pounds or more. These vehicles may also tow vehicles with a GVWR of 10,000 pounds or less
<b>C</b>	Single vehicle with a GVWR of less than 26,001 pounds which requires a CDL endorsement (Hazmat and/or Passenger)

The following *endorsements* and *restrictions* can be placed on Class A, B, or C commercial driver licenses:

Endorsements			Restrictions
<b>H</b>	Transports hazardous materials requiring placards (must be 21 or older and a US citizen or permanent legal resident)	<b>1</b>	Vehicles without air brakes
<b>N</b>	Tanker, 1,000 gallon capacity or more	<b>2</b>	Intrastate Only (See explanation below)
<b>P</b>	Designed to carry 16 or more person including the driver	<b>3</b>	CDL bus only (No longer used)
<b>S</b>	School Bus	<b>4</b>	Restricted to 26,000 or less (No longer used)
<b>T</b>	Double / Triple Trailers	<b>5</b>	No tractor trailers
<b>X</b>	Combination of Tanker and Hazardous Materials	<b>6</b>	No Class A passenger vehicle
		<b>7</b>	No Class B passenger vehicle

Interstate	Intrastate
Authorized to operate a Commercial Motor Vehicle in <b>ALL</b> states	Authorized to operate a Commercial Motor Vehicle <b>ONLY</b> in the state of Florida
Authorized to transport loaded cargo that originated out-of-state	<b>NOT</b> authorized to transport loaded cargo that originated out-of-state
Authorized to transport loaded cargo that is being shipped out-of-state	<b>NOT</b> authorized to transport loaded cargo that is being shipped out-of-state
