1. PURPOSE

This policy provides Mesa Police Department (MPD) members with guidelines for searching vehicles.

2. GENERAL VEHICLE SEARCH PROCEDURES

- A. Locked Areas or Containers.
 - 1. Use key to open rather than force.
 - 2. If key is unavailable, do not force locked containers.

If any person has or claims an interest in the vehicle, it is not abandoned.
Aircraft	Same as motor vehicle.

Motor/Mobile Home	 If apparently mobile, treat as motor vehicle for warrantless search. If affixed to location, treat as structure. 		
Protective Sweep of Vehicle	 Lawful investigatory stop of vehicle. Facts support officer reasonably believing subject is armed and dangerous and has access to weapons. 	Limited to areas in passenger compartment within lunging area where weapons could be.	
VIN (Vehicle Identification Number)	No reasonable expectation of privacy while on public roadway or in public view for the VIN.	Wherever public VIN is placed on particular vehicle.	 Remove anything that blocks view of VIN from outside of vehicle. Check VIN on registration with VIN on vehicle.
Warrant	See Search Warrants.	Limited by warrant.	See Search Warrants.
