To <u>outline</u> the Oath of Office <u>and the Code of Ethics for employees</u>.

.05 Procedures

A. Oath of Office and Sanctity of Life Pledge - Applicable to Troopers

All troopers, prior to assuming a sworn status, will take and subsequently abide by the Oath of Office which reads as follows:

I, ______, do solemnly swear that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the United States of America and to the State of Maryland; that I will serve honestly and faithfully to uphold and defend the Constitution of the United States of America and the Constitution of Maryland; that I will enforce the laws of the State of Maryland; and that I will obey the orders of the Governor and of the Officers appointed over me according to the rules and regulations of the Maryland State Police.

I pledge to respect every human life and act with compassion towards others.

B. State Ethics Requirements - Applicable to All Employees

- 1. All State employees are bound by the Maryland Public Ethics Law (MD. CODE ANN., GEN PROV. § 5-101, et seq.).

C. Code of Ethics - Applicable to Troopers

The MSP has adopted a Code of Ethics based on the IACP model which reads as follows:

As a trooper, my fundamental duty is to serve the community; to safeguard lives and property; to protect the innocent against deception; the weak against oppression or intimidation, and the peaceful against violence or disorder; and to respect the Constitutional rights of all to liberty, equality and justice.

I will keep my private life unsullied as an example to all <u>and will behave in a manner that does not bring discredit to me or the MSP</u>. <u>I will</u> maintain courageous calm in the face of danger, scorn, or ridicule; develop self-restraint; and be constantly mindful of the welfare of others. Honest in thought and deed in both my personal and official life, I will be exemplary in obeying the laws of the land and the regulations of the MSP. Whatever I see or hear of a confidential nature or that is confided to me in my official capacity will be kept ever secret unless revelation is necessary in the performance of my duty.

I will never act officiously or permit personal feelings, prejudices, <u>political beliefs</u>, <u>aspirations</u>, animosities or friendships to influence my decisions. With no compromise for crime and with relentless prosecution of criminals, I will enforce the law courteously and appropriately without fear or favor, malice or ill will, never employing unnecessary force or violence and never accepting gratuities.

I recognize the badge of my office as a symbol of public faith, and I accept it as a public trust to be held so long as I am true to the ethics of police service. I will never engage in acts of corruption or bribery, nor will I condone such acts by other law enforcement officers. I will cooperate with all legally-authorized agencies and their representatives in the pursuit of justice.

I know that I alone am responsible for my own standard of professional performance and will take every reasonable opportunity to enhance and improve my level of knowledge <u>and competence</u>.

I will constantly strive to achieve these objectives and ideals, dedicating myself before God to my chosen profession as a Maryland State Trooper.

D. Ethics Training

The Commander of the Education and Training Division will ensure all employees receive biennial ethics training.
