Internal Affairs Division - Notifications & Investigations

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.01 Purpose

To describe the notification and investigation procedures for the Internal Affairs Division (IAD).

.02 Policy

IAD will be the central repository for all internal investigations involving troopers and <u>will</u> be notified in certain situations.

.03 Definitions

<u>BLUETEAM: a web-based application enabling users to document and monitor incidents to include, but</u> not limited to: citizen/external complaints, internal complaints, firearm discharges, use of force incidents, vehicle pursuits and departmental collisions.

.05 Procedures

A. Notifications

- 1. <u>The</u> IAD will be notified immediately <u>for serious incidents related to liability or which may</u> <u>result in heightened community interest, to include when</u>:
 - a. a trooper uses deadly force, shoots at an individual or is shot;
 - b. a suspect or citizen is seriously injured or killed and MSP personnel are involved;
 - c. a trooper is charged with a criminal offense;
 - d. an allegation of criminal activity is directed at a trooper warranting a police investigation, regardless of jurisdiction of occurrence;
 - e. a trooper's <u>firearm</u> is discharged, other than at the range or the killing of a dangerous or injured animal <u>to relieve its suffering;</u>
 - f. a trooper is found driving an MSP vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or a controlled dangerous substance, or both;
 - g. a trooper is the respondent of a Protective Order; or

- h. a trooper commits any act of serious misconduct warranting an immediate investigation.
- 2. Upon being notified of any of the incidents listed above, the Commander of <u>the</u> IAD will <u>promptly</u> notify the Superintendent directly or through the Superintendent's Chief of Staff.
- 3. <u>The IAD Commander will ensure the Criminal Enforcement Division Commander and the involved</u> trooper's Bureau Chief are notified immediately if he becomes aware of a qualifying incident that has not been promptly reported to the Attorney General's Independent Investigation Division (IID).
- 4. After business hours, the IAD can be notified through the Headquarters Duty Officer.
- B. Investigations
 - 1. Generally, <u>members assigned to the IAD</u> will conduct administrative investigations when:
 - a. a trooper uses deadly force, shoots at an individual, or is shot;
 - b. criminal violations are alleged to have been committed by a trooper;
 - c. a trooper is accused of sexual harassment or discrimination;
 - d. excessive force allegations are made against a trooper;
 - e. a trooper is involved in a departmental collision resulting in a fatality; or
 - f. an administrative investigation is requested by the Superintendent.
 - 2. Situations not listed in <u>B-1 above</u> will be screened by the Commander of <u>the</u> IAD to determine if they will be investigated by <u>the</u> IAD or <u>a local investigator</u>.
- C. <u>Case</u> Tracking
 - 1. <u>Upon learning of an incident requiring an IAD tracking number, commanders will ensure the complaint is entered into BlueTeam. The IAD will assign a tracking number for the incident in BlueTeam.</u>
 - 2. Commanders will report all case dispositions directly to the IAD through BlueTeam routings.
 - 3. Sustained cases resulting in Alternative Disciplinary Procedure, Summary Punishment, <u>a</u> hearing board or waiver of a hearing board will be reported to <u>the</u> IAD at the conclusion of the proceeding.
 - 4. The IAD will record all case dispositions in IAPro.
- D. Annual Analysis of Complaints Against Personnel
 - 1. Annually, the IAD Commander will prepare a summary report of all complaints against personnel that were investigated during the previous calendar year.
 - 2. The report will:
 - a. <u>include data elements required by CALEA and a summary of the Early Intervention</u> <u>Program;</u>
 - b. <u>be forwarded to the Superintendent through the Planning and Research Division</u> <u>annually by March 1; and</u>

c. <u>contain a statistical summary of the prior year's cases that will be made available to</u> <u>the public by the Planning and Research Division</u>.
