## SUBJECT: DIRECTIVE 2019-01 COLLECTION OF LIQUID CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES

The purpose of this directive is to address the handling of liquid controlled substances stored in syringes.

**Effective immediately**, officers will not collect syringes as evidence for submission to the laboratory until a process has been established to properly and safely handle these liquids unless it is critical in the prosecution of a <u>major case</u>. Refer to the following policies for the collection of hypodermic syringes and consult with a supervisor and laboratory personnel prior to packaging for storage and lab submission.

In those instances where a syringe is seized that will not be stored as part of a major case investigation, officers will take a picture of the evidence and then dispose of the syringe in a sharps container.

This directive will be in effect until revisions to the aforementioned policies have been completed.
