

National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians® <small>THE NATION'S EMS CERTIFICATION™</small>	<h1>Live Remote Proctored Examinations</h1>		
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Intent

The intent of this policy is to allow Live Remote Proctored (LRP) examinations and to specify the conditions and standards associated with a Live Remote Proctored examination.

Scope

This policy applies to Live Remote Proctored examinations, whether for National Registry certification, recertification by examination, or proficiency examination offered to State EMS Offices. This policy applies solely to the examination process and does not affect any policies or procedures related to eligibility for certification.

Definitions

Live Remote Proctored (LRP) examination - shall mean an examination offered by secure internet connection, in which the candidate's examination is observed by a live test administrator (e.g., proctor) using audio and video monitoring through the internet connection.

Policy

LRP examinations are administered in a secure and standardized manner. Requirements for secure examination administration are made available to candidates.

Design of Live Remote Proctored Examinations

Passing standards and test plans for LRP examinations are identical to examinations offered through the Pearson VUE test centers via computer-based testing. Standards related to proof of identity are established by the examination test vendor.

The forms for the LRP examinations are the same as the Pearson VUE on-site computer-based testing.

Examination Delivery

Live Remote Proctored examinations are offered exclusively through Pearson VUE's Online Proctored Testing Option Network. Technical specifications for the candidate's computer are provided to candidates prior to testing by Pearson VUE and it is the candidate's responsibility to ensure that their computer and network meet minimum specification requirements prior to their examination time. Candidates for LRP examinations must comply with all Pearson VUE policies and procedures related to LRP examinations and National Registry policies and procedures for examination administration.

Candidates without access to a quiet environment meeting remote proctored testing requirements or computers and network connections to Pearson VUE must complete their examinations at Pearson VUE test centers.

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A live test administrator must proctor all LRP examinations. Live Remote Proctored sessions are video and audio recorded for review as needed. Accommodation for extra time will be available through the LRP examination method, but readers and most other accommodations are not available. See the Accommodations Policy for more information.

The examination forms, administration time, and number of allowed attempts within the candidate's eligibility are the same for both LRP examinations and for examinations administered at Pearson VUE test centers.

If the proctor observes irregular behavior during the examination, the examination will be terminated, and the case reviewed. If the investigation confirms irregular behavior during the examination, the examination attempt will be invalidated and future attempts must be conducted at Pearson VUE test centers, if eligible. Availability of future examinations may be limited in accordance with the Disciplinary Action Policy.

If an examination ends prior to completion due to technical issues without fault of the candidate and Pearson VUE could not restart or continue the examination, the result from that examination will be reviewed for potential nullification or other consideration. If a candidate completed more than 30% of the total examination time, the examination would count as an attempt at the computer-based certification examination.

If a technical error occurs during a LRP examination and the candidate and Pearson VUE can restart or continue the examination to full completion without the candidate's request to reschedule at the time of the error, the reported results will be upheld.

Applications for Live Remote Proctored Examinations

Live Remote Proctored examinations are not available for all National Registry certification levels. This determination is based on assessed risk overall and examination security. If National Registry is currently offering the LRP examination method at the time of candidate application, the website and application will be maintained and updated appropriately.

A candidate must meet all eligibility and application requirements to apply for a computer-based certification examination. Once all requirements are met, including payment of the examination, an Authorization to Test (ATT) will be made available. The candidate will select a test administration mode (Remote Proctored Examination or Pearson VUE test center) in the Pearson VUE application webpage. Candidates will be allowed to change the mode of examination administration until the time of their scheduled examination.

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Rationale

Per NCCA Accreditation, for each testing administration modality, such as the LRP method, the program (National Registry) should design delivery and administration policies to maintain examination security and ensure examinees have a fair opportunity to demonstrate their knowledge, skills, and abilities. 22-Resolution-01 further identified which certification levels are permissible for LRP examination delivery based on assessed risk to examination security.
