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I. POLICY

It is the policy of the Newark Police Department to coordinate our resources with that of support agencies within the City of Newark as it pertains to information sharing regarding wanted high profile/violent offenders, intelligence, crime bulletins and increased utilization of the State Police Emergency Network (S.P.E.N.).

II. PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to provide the Newark Police Department with guidelines for information sharing with support agencies within the City of Newark.

III. DEFINITIONS

- A. Support Agencies- Police agencies located within the City of Newark, ie; Essex County College, Rutgers, New Jersey Institute of Technology (N.J.I.T.), New Jersey Transit and Essex County Sheriff's Department.
- B. Memorandum of Understanding- An agreement between agencies that delineates specific responsibilities for each agency.

IV. PROCEDURES

- A. Criminal Investigations Bureau/Crime Analyst
 - 1) Forward copies of warrant information on high profile/violent offenders to support agencies via e-mail or fax.
 - 2) Forward intelligence ie, threats on police officers etc. to support agencies via e-mail or fax.
 - 3) Forward crime bulletins to support agencies via e-mail or fax.
 - 4) Disseminate information received from support agencies at the daily morning meetings.



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- B. Office of Records/Communications
 - 1) Broadcast general alarms or BOLO'S (Be On Lookout) on S.P.E.N.
 - 2) Monitor S.P.E.N. for broadcasts from support agencies that affect the City of Newark.
 - 3) Contact support agencies and request assistance or backup on police shootings or other high profile in progress assignments.

- C. District Detective Squads
 - 1) Forward pictures of wanted persons to support agencies.
 - 2) Advise support agencies of crime patterns that may affect their agency.
 - 3) Coordinate joint operations with support agencies when crime patterns are discovered that affect mutual agencies.


V. RESPONSIBILITY FOR COMPLIANCE
