COMMAND NOTIFICATION

POLICY:

It is the policy of the Omaha Police Department (OPD) to notify respective bureau Deputy Chiefs and the Chief of Police of unusual occurrences, injuries, deaths, or other serious incidents.

PROCEDURE:

I. Command Notification Requirements

- A. The precinct/section captain or unit/squad supervisor shall contact their bureau Deputy Chief to notify them of serious incidents via telephone or text message as described in this policy.
- B. Bureau Deputy Chiefs will determine whether or not to contact the Chief of Police upon being notified of incidents.

II. Telephone Notifications

- A. Incidents that require immediate telephone notification of the respective bureau Deputy Chief include the following:
 - 1. Serious injury (hospitalization) to an officer or civilian, resulting from police action.
 - 2. Person of any age missing under suspicious circumstances or where foul play is suspected.
 - 3. Officer-involved shooting or firearms discharge (excluding destruction of animals or noninjury discharge).
 - 4. Hostage situations.
 - 5. Incident serious enough for an employee to be relieved of duty.
 - 6. Major disturbances. Examples include, but are not limited to the following:
 - a. Spontaneous civil unrest.
 - b. Large disturbances that require skirmish lines to control.
 - c. Large disturbances that significantly affect normal business operations.
 - 7. Significant disasters. Examples include, but are not limited to the following:
 - a. Natural or manmade events that cause large-scale damage to property and/or multiple injuries or deaths such as tornado damage, plane crashes with multiple injuries or deaths, or terrorist acts.
 - 8. Detonation of bomb or explosive device resulting in significant damage or injury.
 - 9. Pursuit resulting in serious injuries (hospitalization) or significant property damage.
 - 10. Incidents that result in multiple deaths or multiple serious injuries.
 - 11. Death on city property.

III. Text Message Notifications

- A. Incidents that require notification of the respective bureau Deputy Chief via text message as soon as feasible include the following:
 - 1. Homicide or traffic fatality.
 - 2. Any incident which is significant due to unusual circumstances. Examples include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - a. Prominent citizen's suicide.
 - b. Mass destruction of property.
 - c. Barricade incidents.
 - d. Incident that receives significant news media coverage.
 - 3. Arrests made in OPD buildings or on OPD property that are not related to a criminal investigation.

EXAMPLE: An individual causes a disturbance at the OPD Central Headquarters Front Desk that results in their arrest.

IV. Coordination When Planning Enforcement Operations

- A. The Deputy Chiefs of the appropriate bureaus shall be notified during the initial planning stages of enforcement operations that are being coordinated between bureaus. Examples include the following:
 - 1. Operations with potential for a large number of arrests (more than ten people).
 - 2. Operations that may attract significant media attention.
