V. PURPOSE:

This policy defines the credentialing criteria for the Specialty of Pain Management.

VI. POLICY / PROCEDURE:

The specialist must meet all the criteria to be a Partnership HealthPlan of California (Partnership) contracted specialist, as stated in Policy MPCR300 – Physician Credentialing and Re-credentialing Requirements. In addition, the contracted specialist must meet the following criteria to be considered a Pain Management Specialist:

- A. The specialist must be board-certified or board-eligible by either the American Board of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology, the American Board of Family Medicine, the American Board of Emergency Medicine or the American Board of Anesthesiology and the specialist must have a Subspecialty in Pain Management conferred by one of these specialty boards OR
- B. The specialist must be board-certified or board-eligible by one of the aforementioned boards and must have been engaged at least 50% of the time for the previous two years in the practice of Pain Management OR
- C. The specialist must be board-certified or board-eligible by one of the aforementioned boards and must have completed 12 months of specialized post-graduate training in Pain Management OR
- D. The specialist must be board-certified or board-eligible in one of the aforementioned boards and must have completed a combination of the requirements in B. and C.
