#### V. PURPOSE:

To establish credentialing criteria for the American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS) recognized specialty of Hospice and Palliative Care. There has been a specifically outlined pathway to credentialing set forth by the American Academy of Hospice and Palliative Care Medicine that has included a grand parenting for those physicians who have practiced the specialty but not taken a fellowship.

#### VI. POLICY / PROCEDURE:

Each specialist must meet all the criteria to be a Partnership HealthPlan of California (Partnership) contracted specialist, as stated in Policy MPCR300 Section V.B: Initial Credentialing Criteria. Refer also to "Application to be a Contracted Outpatient Palliative Care Provider" as noted in Related Policies MCUP3137 Attachment D and MCUP3140 Attachment C.

In order to be recognized as a specialist in Hospice and Palliative Care the physician must satisfy the following requirements:

- A. Having previously been Board Certified by the American Board of Hospice and Palliative Medicine with an expiration date of December 31, 2008 or later OR
- B. Have current Board Certification in Hospice and Palliative Medicine recognized by the American Board of Medical Specialties OR
- C. Be currently Board of Hospice and Palliative Medicine eligible and planning to sit for the board examination with future credentialing pending passing the examination OR
- D. Be currently Board of Hospice and Palliative Medicine eligible based upon completing an accredited

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fellowship in the specialty.

E. Under existing federal law, licensed health professionals employed by a tribal health program are required to be exempt, if licensed in any state, from the licensing requirements of the state in which the tribal health program performs specified services.
