PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED FY25 PD BUDGET MINUTES OF THE FEBRUARY 14th, 2024, PRESENTATION

5:30 p.m. Public Session – Conference Room A, City Hall

 I. <u>CALL TO ORDER</u>: The February 14th, 2024, Public Hearing on the Police Department's proposed FY25 budget was called to order at 5:30 p.m. in Conference Room A in City Hall. (A recording of this meeting is available on the City's website & City's Youtube Channel)

II. PRESENTATION OF THE PROPOSED FY '25 BUDGET:

Using a PowerPoint presentation, Chief Newport presented a preliminary budget proposal. Chief Newport and Karen Senecal discussed the elements of each new budget 'ask' for the upcoming FY25 budget, to including accreditation costs, additional staffing costs, training costs, and equipment (body cameras and tasers) & software upgrade costs. The FY25 budget impacts were also summarized, and a breakdown was provided. The requested FY25 budget shows a 4.49% increase from last year, for a total budget request of \$14,586,698. Of the total budget, 86% consists of salary and benefits, 5% overtime costs, 7% "other operating" costs, and 2% for the City's contractual obligations.

The PD's Capital Improvement Plan includes a new police facility, funds for current facility deficiencies and repairs, and body cameras. Chief Newport outlined the department's rolling stock plan for various police vehicles. Older police vehicles are often repurposed for use by the department's School Resource Officers or the Animal Control Officer.
