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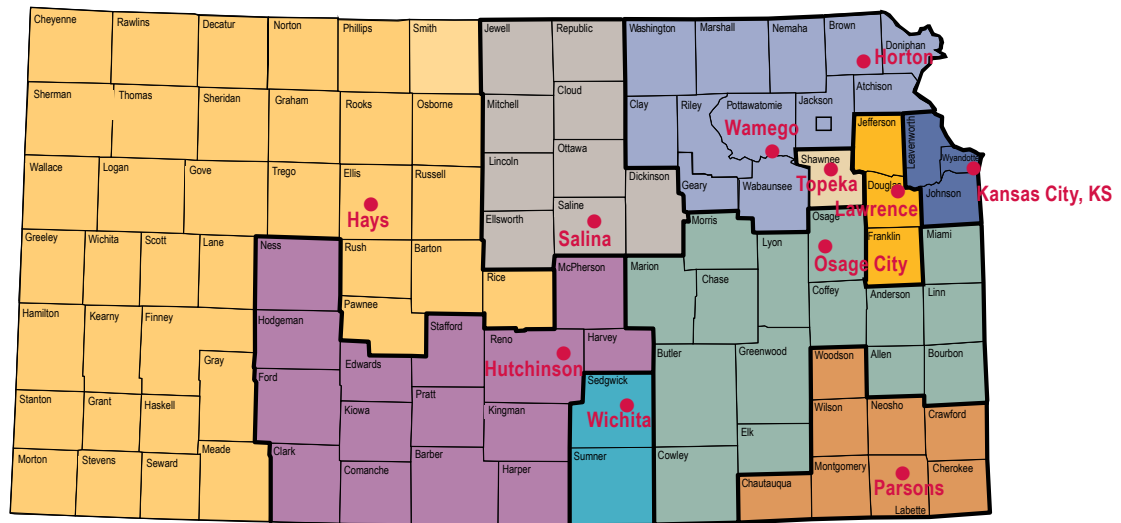

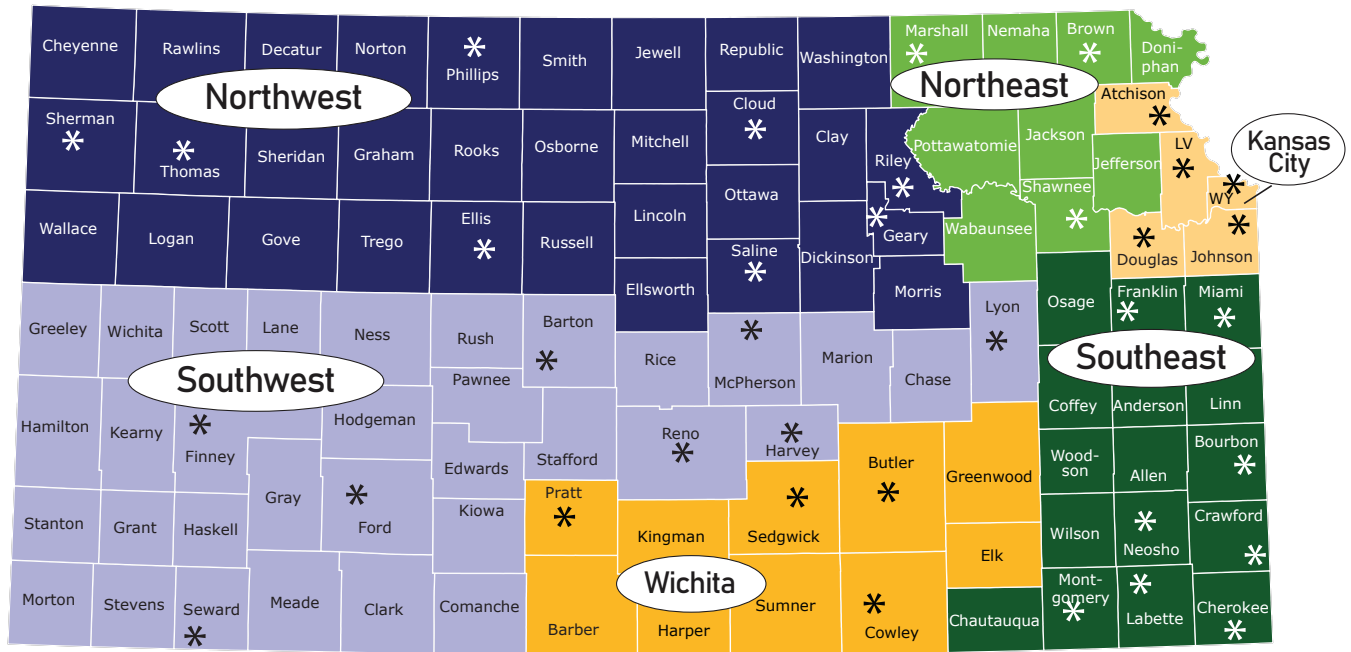

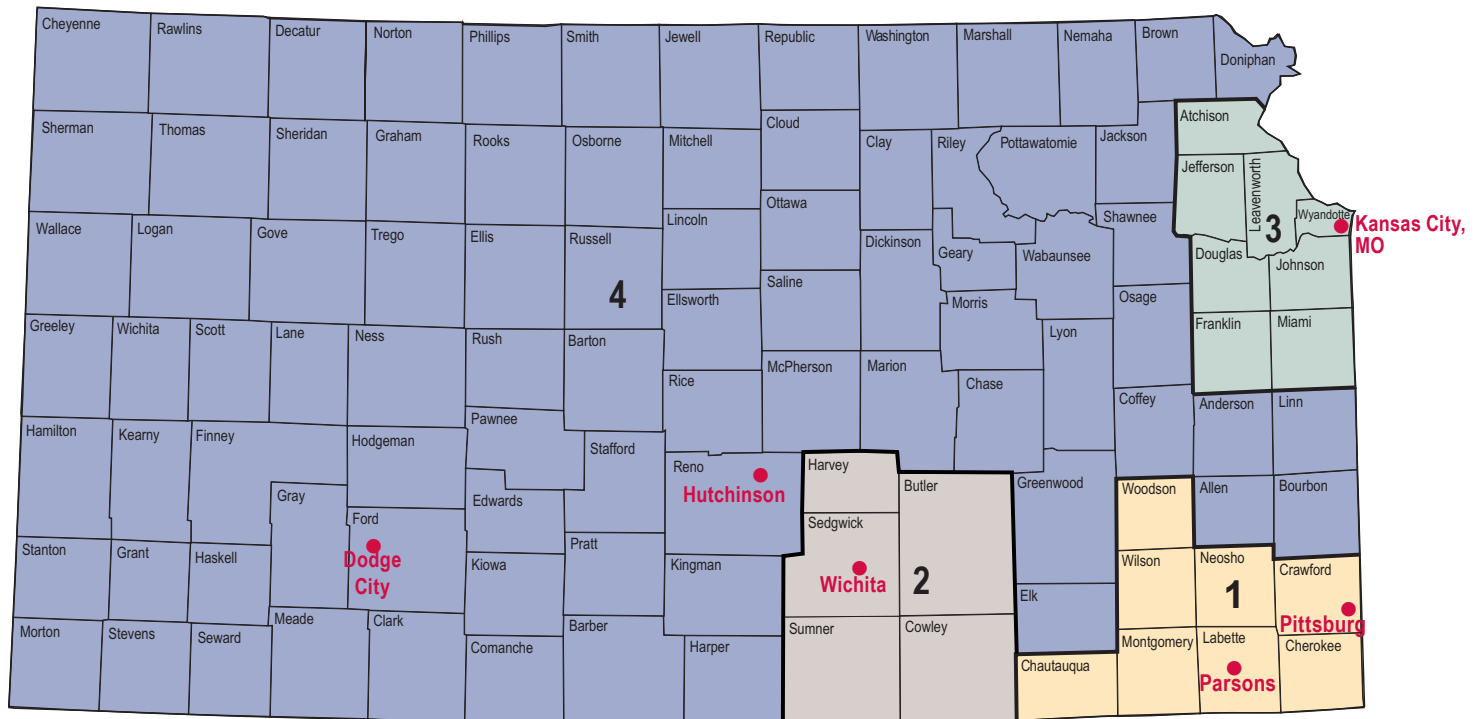

Services for people who are blind or visually impaired are provided through a contract from the Vocational Rehabilitation Services to three groups: Alphapointe Association for the Blind, Kansas City; Envision Vision Rehabilitation Center, Wichita and a consortium of independent living centers headed by Prairie Independent Living Resource Center, Hutchinson. These groups provide services to support independent living and employment. These groups increase capacity in specialized areas such as orientation and mobility, rehabilitation teaching, independent living skills training, Braille instruction and assistive technology.

They can also pay for PACE privately, if they do not have either.

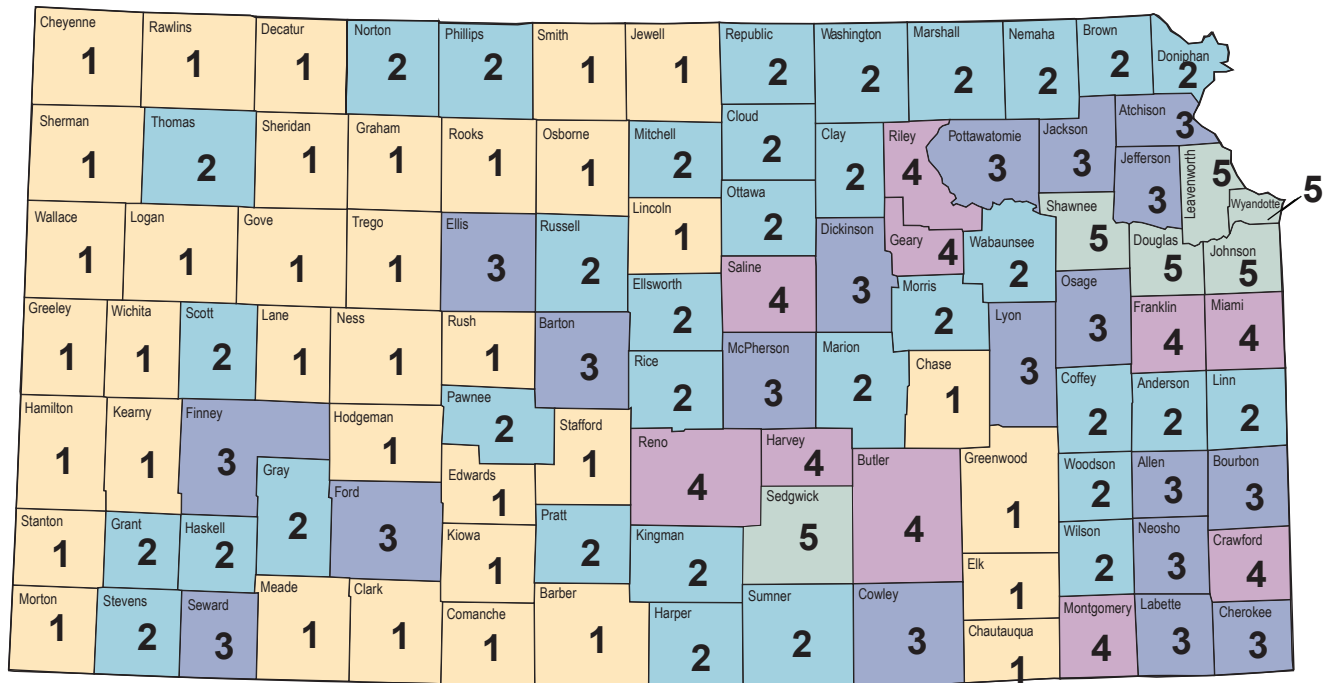

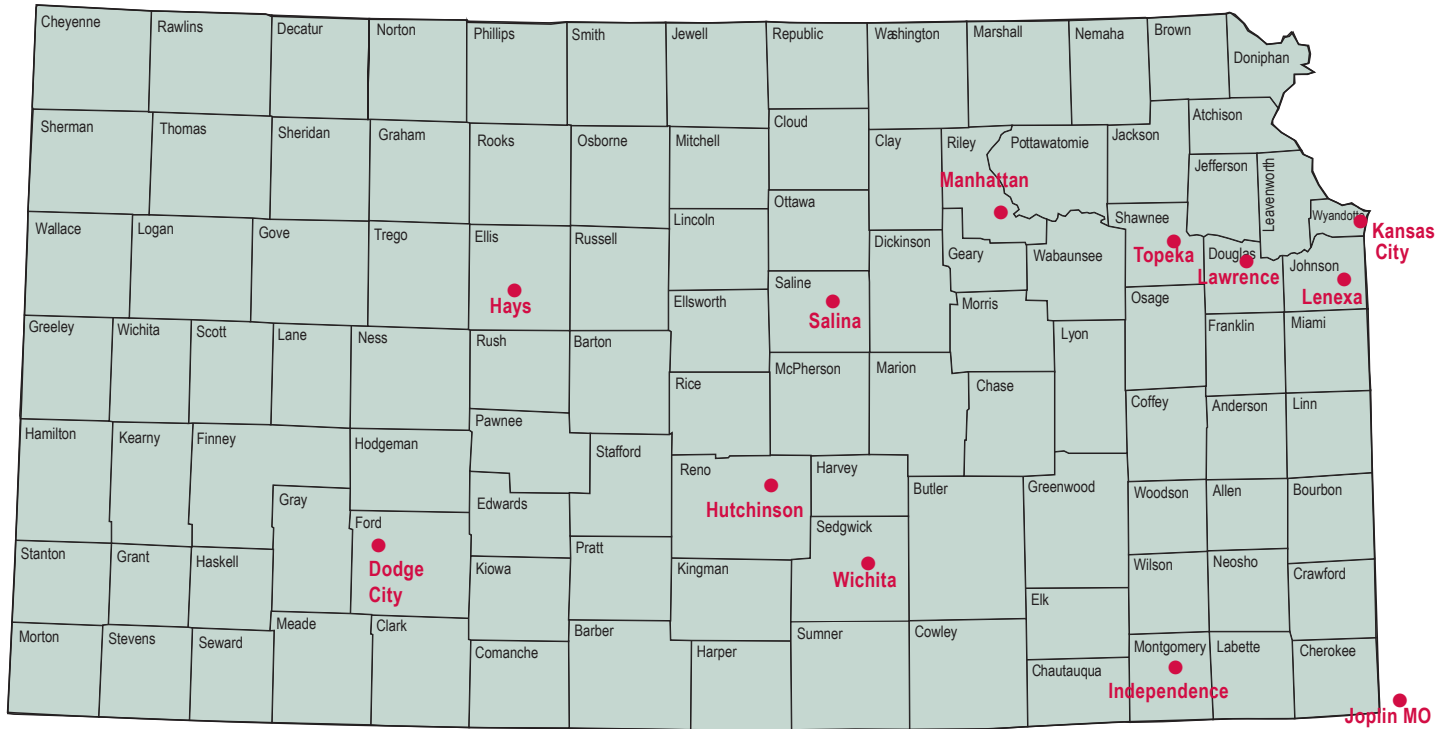
