Have you always wanted a job that REALLY makes a difference? There are few jobs more important than being a Public Safety Dispatcher. In an emergency, your voice is the first heard by somebody in need, and your skills save lives.

Is the Job Right For You?

Being a Public Safety Dispatcher is not a job for everyone. To find out if you would be right for this job, ask yourself the following:

- Would you be able to handle a high volume of calls and make decisions quickly and accurately?
- Could you use questioning and inquiry skills to draw out specific information from callers who are upset, frightened, abused or hurt while remaining calm and emotionally detached?
- Do you have good communication skills and the ability to treat callers courteously and tactfully?
- Are you willing to work the shifts a structured 24/7 workplace requires?

If your answers are “yes”, the role of Public Safety Dispatcher may be for you.

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities

- Ability to at least type 35 words per minute with no more than five errors.
- Ability to communicate in a clear speaking voice on both the telephone and radio.
- Ability to analyze and solve problems.
- Ability to hear and understand radio and telephone transmissions through headsets, handsets, and speakers, sometimes with interference, static, and background noise.
- Ability to sit for long periods of time and to use hands and fingers repetitively to operate computers and other standard office equipment.
- Skill in communicating effectively with persons in difficult, life-threatening, and other emergency situations.
- Ability to read and interpret data, information, and documents.
- Skill in understanding and following detailed oral and written instructions.
- Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships.
- Ability to quickly read fine print, charts, graphs, maps, computer monitors, and see fine detail with no color deficiencies.

Qualifications Include

- You must be at least 18 years of age at the time of employment
- You must be a high school graduate or possess a GED
- You must be free from a conviction of a Felony or Class “A” Misdemeanor
