What Would I Do?

The St. Louis County Police Cadet will receive paid work experience in various divisions within the Department.

Cadets will Ride-On-Patrol with each of the eight County Police Precincts, as well as work within the following units:

- Bureau of Communications
- Crime Scene Unit
- Police Crime Laboratory
- St. Louis County and Municipal Police Academy
- Personnel Services Unit
- Fingerprint Unit

These assignments will allow the Cadet to become familiar with various Department units while assisting them in their daily operations.

How Do I Qualify?

- Must be 18 years of age, but no older than 21 years of age.
- A high school diploma or GED prior to the start of the program.
- Enrolled or anticipate enrolling in an accredited university or college, or
- Have at least 33 credit hours from an accredited college or university.
- Must submit written referral from a School Administrator or Facilitator prior to being considered.
