Instructions for PREA Risk Assessment CS-0946

1. Training is required before any agency staff member completes this assessment.
2. This assessment is completed on youth, per PREA standards, within seventy-two (72) hours of admission to a residential facility, group home, treatment center, or Youth Development Center (YDC) by a trained agency designee.
3. The staff person interviewing the youth reviews the youth's case file before finalizing this form for collateral information gathered from other sources than the youth. If collateral information is different from what the youth reports and indicates the youth is more vulnerable than their self-report, it should be noted on the form and score amended as applicable.
4. The interviewer asks the youth questions that are in bold. All questions are read as written on the form; however, if the youth does not understand the question the interviewer can rephrase it as long as the intent of the question remains clear.
5. If the youth reports a sexual experience they did not want to have, report the information to the DCS Child Abuse Hotline at 1-877-237-0004.
6. The question regarding intellectual impairment is answered from information learned during the file review.
7. Once the interview is finished, the interviewer completes the "Lack of Fit" section and scores it.
8. Scores from section 1-9 are transferred to the Overall Risk Score section so that an overall score can be calculated. Use the Vulnerability to Victimization and the Sexually Aggressive Behavior scores to complete form CS-1236, Safe Housing Assessment. The CS-1236 Safe Housing Assessment is used to determine dorm/room/bed assignments.
9. Completed screenings are shared with treatment staff to assist in housing decisions. A copy is uploaded into in the youth's case file in DCS electronic filing system.
