Glossary:

- Statutory Agreement
 - o An agreement or undertaking entered into under any legislation.
- ◆ Compact
 - An agreement or covenant between two or more parties.

Policy Statement:

The Interstate Compact on the Placement of Children (ICPC) is a statutory agreement between all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and the US Virgin Islands. The State of Tennessee is a party to the Interstate Compact on the Placement of Children (ICPC) and as such cooperates with the other member states and territories in accordance with the provisions of the Compact.

The Tennessee Department of Children's Services (DCS) ICPC office is responsible for the daily tasks associated with the administration of the compact. All incoming and outgoing interstate placement requests are processed through this office.

Purpose:

The purpose of the ICPC is to ensure that children placed out-of-state are placed with caregivers who are safe, suitable, and able to meet their needs. The ICPC requires an assessment of these factors before a child is placed out-of-state. As a legally binding

agreement, the ICPC ensures that children enjoy a uniform set of protections and benefits regardless of which state they are moving to or from.

Procedures:

A. ICPC Application

The ICPC governs the following types of placements:

- a) The placement of a child in the care or custody of a state child welfare agency with a relative family, a foster family, or an adoptive family in another state;
- b) The placement of a child by any individual or entity into another state if the placement is for the purpose of adoption;
- c) Under certain circumstances, the placement of a child with the child's parent located in another state;
- d) The placement of a child by any individual or entity into a licensed residential treatment center located in another state, to include youth who have been adjudicated delinquent; or
- e) Court jurisdiction only: The sending court has an open abuse, neglect or dependency case that establishes court jurisdiction with the authority to supervise, remove and/or place the child. This child is **not** in the guardianship/custody of DCS.

B. ICPC Administration

The TN DCS Commissioner serves as the ICPC Compact Administrator. The Commissioner designates a Deputy Commissioner who shall serve as the general coordinator of activities under this compact in the State of Tennessee and who, acting jointly with like officers of other party jurisdictions, shall have power to promulgate rules and regulations to carry out more effectively the terms and provisions of this compact. The rules and regulations are outlined in *The Interstate Compact on the Placement of Children (ICPC) Procedural Guide* and *The Interstate Compact on the Placement of Children (ICPC) Judicial Guide*.
