

## Tennessee Department of Children's Services Criteria for Authorizing TennCare

## Supplemental to DCS Policy: 15.15

- 1. A Title IV-E foster child who subsequently transitions to a Subsidized Permanent Guardianship (SPG) Program is categorically eligible for companion TennCare Medicaid benefits.
- A child receiving Subsidized Permanent Guardianship (SPG) through <u>state</u> funding is not categorically eligible for TennCare Medicaid. A determination of TennCare eligibility must be completed to determine if the state funded SPG child may be receive TennCare coverage.
- 3. A child placed in Tennessee under the Interstate Compact on the Placement of Children remains in the jurisdiction of the sending state and is
  - ineligible for Tennessee's SPG program; and
  - not categorically eligible for companion TennCare Medicaid benefits.
- 4. The Permanency Specialist shall provide the following supporting documentation to the Child Welfare Benefits Unit to initiate TennCare coverage for Subsidized Permanent Guardianship children who are categorically eligible for TennCare:
  - a) Copy of the Subsidized Permanent Guardianship Agreement, CS-0721
  - b) Copy of the <u>Intent to Obtain Subsidized Permanent Guardianship Placement Agreement (Part 1)</u> <u>and Application for Subsidized Permanent Guardianship (Part 2), CS-0719</u>
  - c) The child's Social Security Number
  - d) The date the child exits state custody and enters Subsidized Permanent Guardianship of the caretaker;
  - e) Notification if the Subsidized Permanent Guardianship Agreement is terminated.
- 5. The Child Welfare Benefits Unit shall authorize TennCare coverage for Subsidized Permanent Guardianship children who are categorically eligible for TennCare by completing the following actions.
  - a) Close the child's IV-E foster care case effective the month the child transitions into the Subsidized Permanent Guardianship Program.
  - b) Continue TennCare coverage for the SPG child in the Accent TennCare case for a former IV-E foster care child.
  - c) Continue or open a TennCare case on Accent for a state funded SPG child who has medical or rehabilitative needs.
  - d) Change the Accent Living Arrangement code to "26".
  - e) Enter the Guardian's address in the Accent AEICI screen for a SPG child.
  - f) Maintain the SPG child's active TennCare case on Accent as long as the Subsidized Permanent Guardianship Agreement is in effect.
  - g) Close the SPG child's active Accent TennCare case if the Subsidized Permanent Guardianship Agreement is terminated. Refer the family to the local DHS Family Assistance office for TennCare Coverage.

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
