POLICY STATEMENT

Texas Woman's University (TWU) recognizes that the illegal use of drugs and alcohol by members of the university community can have a detrimental impact on the ability of the TWU community to accomplish its mission. TWU requires a drug-free educational and workplace community in compliance with federal and state laws.

This policy is applicable to TWU Students, Faculty, Staff, and Guests.

POLICY

University Regulations and Procedures – Drug-Free University Community and Workplace

Adoption of Regulations and Procedures. The Drug-Free Schools and Campuses Regulations require an institution of higher education (IHE) to certify it has adopted and implemented a program to prevent the unlawful possession, use, or distribution of illicit drugs and alcohol by students and employees. TWU shall adopt University Regulations and Procedures for drug and alcohol education, testing, and enforcement throughout TWU. TWU will implement drug and alcohol policies and programs in compliance with federal and state laws.

REVIEW

This policy will remain in effect and published until it is reviewed, updated, or archived. This policy is to be reviewed once every six years. Interim review may be required as a result of updates to federal and state law or regulations, or internal processes or procedures.
