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PPM 00-27 Eligibility for the Welfare-to-Work Program (October 19, 2000)

On July 1, 2000, the eligibility criteria was changed for the Welfare-to-Work Program. Former foster children who have attained 18 years of age, but not 25 years of age are eligible for Welfare-to-Work Program services. All former foster children in this age range and all clients in the Young Adult Program will qualify for these services. The former foster children and YAP clients may still be in school or out of school when receiving these services.

The Welfare-to-Work Program offers a large variety of services that former foster children and YAP clients may now access. The following services are available:

- Intake, assessment, eligibility determination, and development of an individualized service strategy and case management;
- Job readiness activities;
- Employment, such as on-the-job training, community service, work experience and job creation programs; and
- Job placement.

Additionally, the Welfare-to-Work Program can provide post-employment services, which are provided after an individual is placed in an employment activity. The supportive services include:

- Basic educational skills training, tutoring, occupational skills training, mentoring, and English as a second language training;
- Job retention and support services, such as transportation assistance, child care assistance, emergency or short term housing assistance, other supportive services; and
- Individual development accounts.

These services are valuable resources to assist our foster children leaving care at age 18 and YAP clients transitioning into employment and independence. A referral for these services should be considered in planning for any foster child soon to become 18 years old. Each YAP client's case should be reviewed to determine if he or she would benefit from any of these services. The Welfare-to-Work Referral Form is attached and should be completed on any foster child leaving care at age 18 or any YAP client in need of these services. Numbers 16, 17, and 18 of the referral form do not need to be completed. Number 19 should be completed with the TIPS number of the referral. The completed form should be submitted to the Program Director of the appropriate Local Workforce Investment Area (LWIA). The contact persons, address and telephone numbers of the local LWIAs are listed in the attachment and their staff are ready to assist us.
