203.1 PURPOSE

The purpose of this order is to describe the organizational structure of the Department.

203.2 DEFINITIONS

Bureau: A primary subdivision of the Department.

Division: A functional component within or smaller than a bureau.

Unit: A functional component within a division or bureau.

Squad: A time division of the day for purposes of assignment.

203.3 ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE AND FUNCTIONS

- A. All employees of the University of Chicago Police Department work under the authority of the Chief of Police. The Chief of Police reports directly to the Associate Vice President of Safety and Security and is responsible for the overall planning, organizing and directing of the Police Department.
- B. The University of Chicago Police Department, the Office of Campus Safety and the Office of Emergency Management each utilize Department personnel, under the overall direction of the Associate Vice President of Safety and Security. The Police Department is organized into three organizational components.
 - 1. Field Services.
 - 2. Support Services.

- 3. Community Engagement.
- C. The organizational components are subdivided into smaller organizational components, such as divisions, squads and units, as may be appropriate.
- D. The organizational subdivisions are grouped by function.
 - 1. Field Services.
 - a. Patrol A Squad.
 - b. Patrol B Squad.
 - c. Patrol C Squad.
 - d. Patrol D Squad.
 - e. Special Operations.
 - f. Criminal Investigations Unit.
 - 2. Support Services.
 - a. Professional Standards and Training.
 - b. Emergency Communications Center and Records Unit.
 - c. School Resource Officers.
 - d. Patrol Community Service Officers.
 - 3. Community Engagement.
 - a. Community Relations Unit.
 - b. Police Activities League Officer.
- E. The Office of Campus Safety is organized into four organizational components.
 - 1. Security Services (Contract Security)
 - 2. Security and Law Enforcement Systems.

- 3. Office of Professional Accountability.
 - 4. Primary/Secondary (N-12) Campus Security
 - a. Laboratory Schools (2 campuses)
 - 1) Community Service Officers
 - b. Charter Schools (4 campuses)
 - 1) Community Service Officers
- F. The Office of Emergency Management.
- 1. Emergency Communication Center.
