SUBJECT: Annual Review of Temporary Custody of Juveniles Policy 310

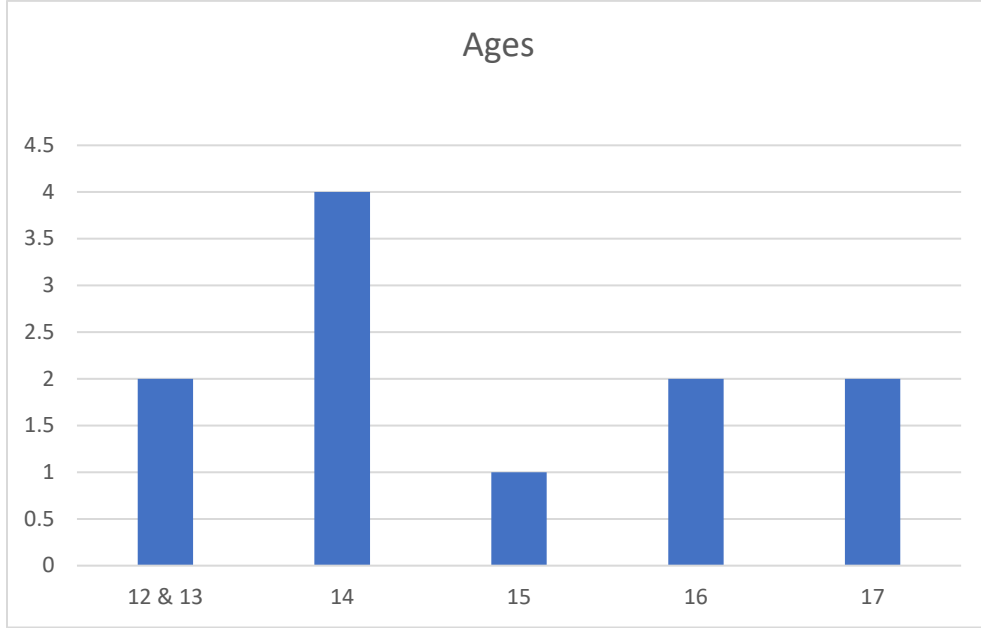
Pursuant to the Temporary Custody of Juveniles Policy 310, a documented annual administrative review of the practices and data collected on youth arrests by charge, age, race, and use of force shall be conducted. The Chief of Police, or designee, will also ensure annual reporting pursuant to the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act is completed.

Lt. Holton is responsible for submitting the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) quarterly reports detailing juveniles held as secured and unsecured at the Worthington Division of Police. Those quarterly reports were complete and submitted to Danny Turek of the Ohio Department of Youth Services in each quarter of 2025.

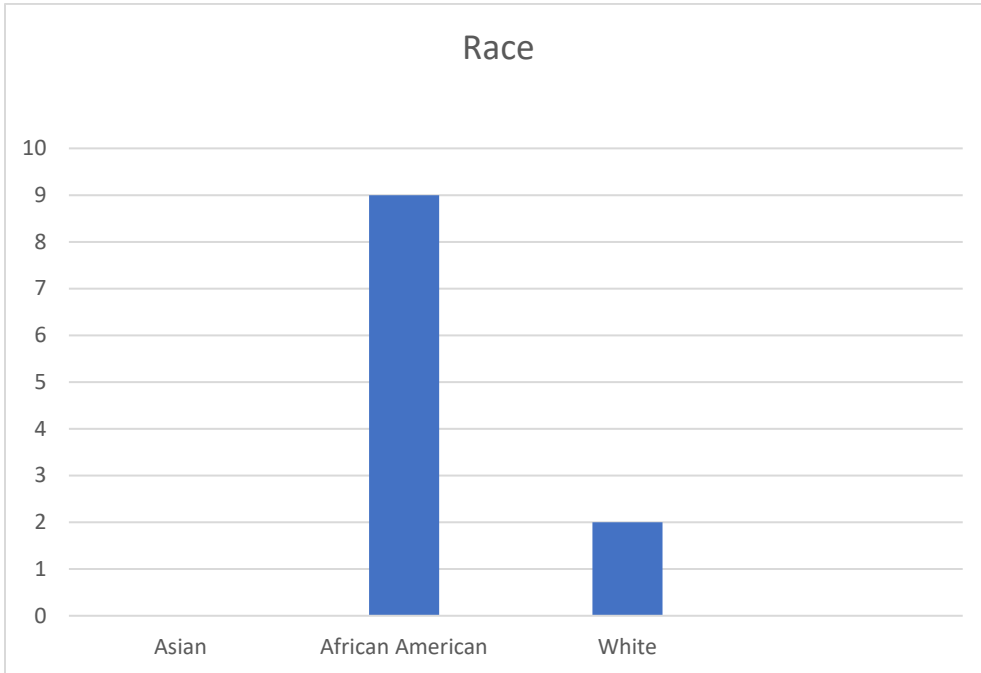
The Division's reporting and records management system (RMS) captures and secures juvenile interaction data in an effective manner to allow for analysis to occur. Division officers filed charges on eleven (11) juveniles in 2025. While they all technically count as an arrest, eight (8) juveniles were released to an adult, two (2) were transported to the hospital for evaluation, and one (1) was released to another law enforcement agency. No juveniles were transported to or detained in a juvenile detention facility in 2025.

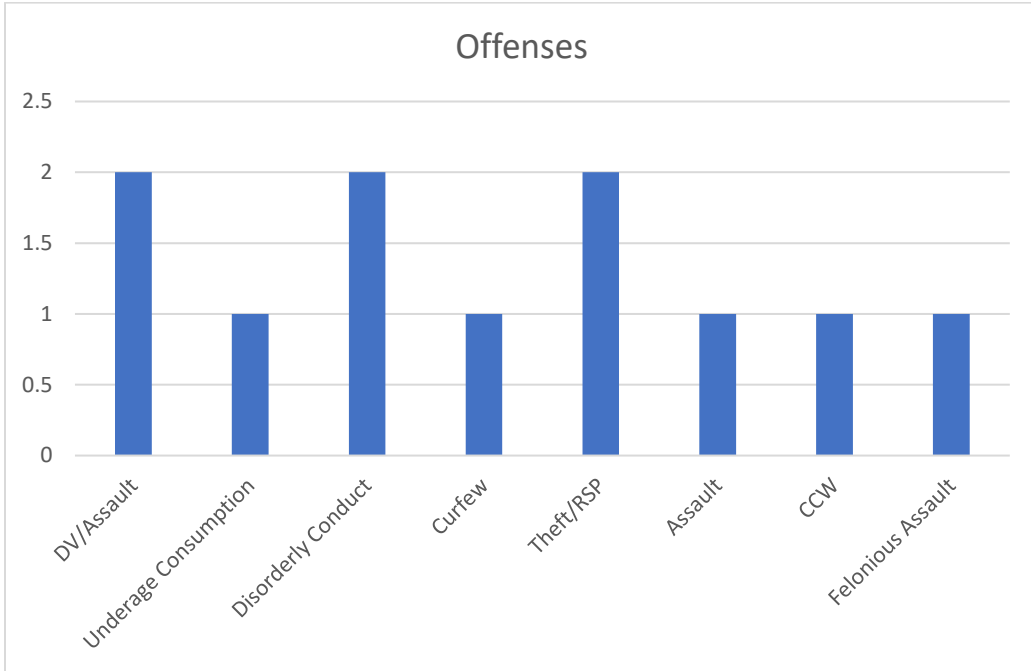
Ages of Charged Juveniles



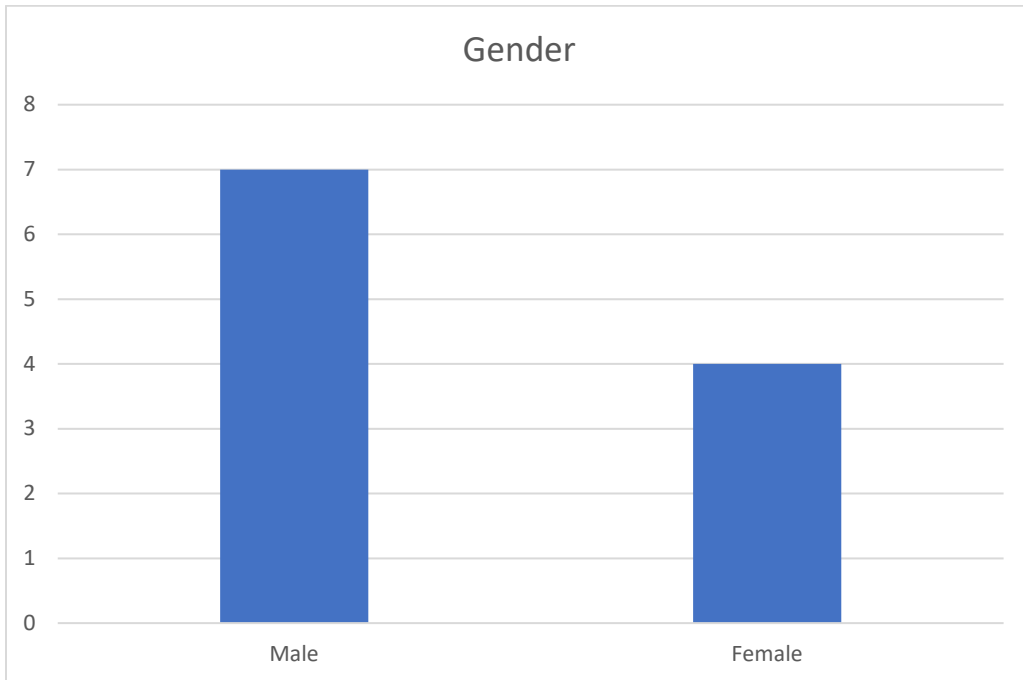
Race of Charged Juveniles



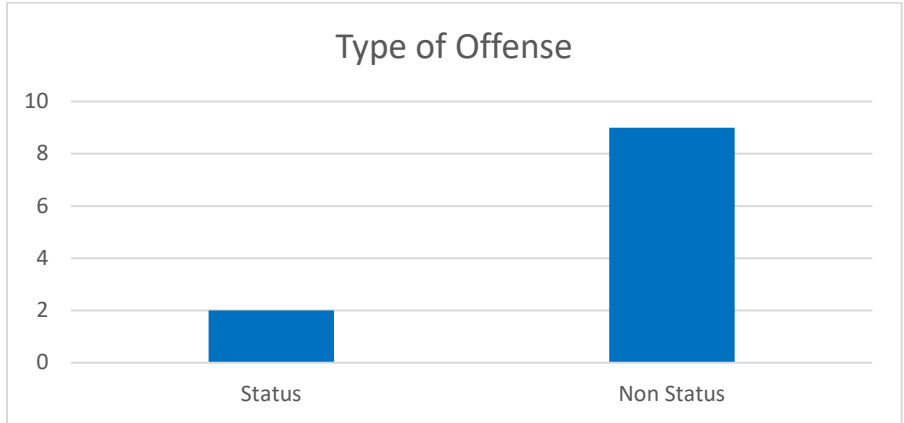
Offenses for which Juveniles were Charged



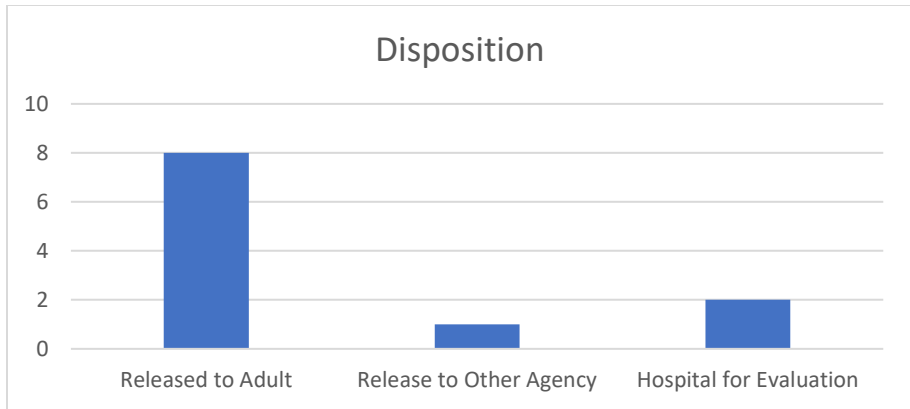
Gender of Charged Juveniles
