



- Deputy Sheriffs shall keep their uniforms clean and pressed, their shoes and other leather equipment polished and shined, and badges and nameplates clean and bright. Shoes and socks shall be black in color and of an approved type.
- Deputy Sheriffs and/ or employees wearing civilian clothing on duty shall present a neat and clean appearance.
- Employees shall wear clothing that is appropriate to the type of duties and citizen contacts that are expected, (e.g., coat and tie for men and equivalent skirt, blouse, or pants outfit for women that are appropriate for business contacts; more informal sports clothing may be appropriate for specific instances as approved by the individual's supervisor.
- Civilian dress should not be a source of negative comment from the community.
- Court Attire
  - Uniforms or civilian business attire (coat and tie for men or equivalent for women) shall be worn for all court appearances.
- End of Employment Equipment Turn In
  - When an employee terminates employment, all issued equipment shall be returned no later than on the day that the termination is effective.
  - Failure to return all items of county property will result taking legal action, civil or criminal.

- 243       ○ Specialized uniforms are issued to the following:

- 250       ○ Specialized uniforms may be worn for the following:
- 251           ▪ When authorized by Sheriff and as directed by the commander or supervisor of

- 254   • Method of wear
- 255       ○ Either the long sleeve shirt or the short sleeve shirt may be worn year around for
- 256       normal duty.
- 257       ○ The long sleeve shirt with tie shall be worn when formal occasions dictate
- 258       ○ During non-formal occasions, a long sleeve shirt may be worn with a tie or a navy or
- 259       black crew neck t-shirt or navy or optional black mock turtleneck
- 260       ○ When wearing a short sleeve shirt, a navy blue or black crew neck T-shirt is required
- 261       for both male and female employees.
- 262       ○ Hats are optional, unless special occasions dictate their use.
- 263       ○ All uniforms worn shall be blue with black basket weave leather gear.
- 264       ○ Uniform shirts and coats shall display the Sheriff's Office patch on each shoulder.
- 265       ○ White uniform shirts will be worn by command staff at the discretion of the Sheriff.
- 266       ○ Name plates shall be worn with the Class A and Class B uniform.

- Name plates shall have at a minimum the deputy's first and middle name initial and last name.
- Name plates shall be worn centered on the right pocket, aligned with the pocket seam, approximately ¼ inch below the top of the pocket
- Approved shoes/boots shall be the following style:
  - Patent leather/high gloss style.
  - Leather or synthetic material that can be polished.
  - Boots may have a limited amount of nylon along the tongue and sides along with minimal rubber toe protection.
- Sheriff's Office polo shirts are approved for bicycle patrol deputies and other employees at the discretion of the Sheriff.
- Class C and/or specialized uniforms are approved for specialized personnel (ERT members, training instructors, DARE officers, crime prevention, etc.) at the discretion of the Sheriff for special events.
- Uniforms will not be worn or used off duty with the exception of extra duty assignments for the York-Poquoson Sheriff's Office and Court.
- No assigned uniform apparel is to be worn while off duty.
- Uniform and equipment replacement
  - When uniform or equipment items are lost, damaged or worn out and are in need of replacement, deputies shall request replacement or repair in writing to their supervisor.
  - Each supervisor will approve or disapprove the request and forward it to the supply officer, giving reasons why the items are in need of replacement.
  - No replacement will be made without a like item to be turned in unless with approval from a supervisor if no like item is available to be turned in.
- Severance procedures
  - Employees leaving service with the Sheriff's Office through retirement, resignation or termination shall turn in all issued uniforms and equipment.
  - All employees who are severing employment with the Sheriff's Office and who has been assigned uniforms and equipment will be assigned to the Administrative Services Division for the last workday for exit processing.
  - It shall be the responsibility of the employee's immediate supervisor to ensure that the employee has accounted for all uniforms and equipment prior to being assigned to the Administrative Services Division.
  - Each employee will turn in his or her issued firearm, ammunition, magazines to the Sheriff's Office armorer.
  - Any employee terminating his or her employment, who fails to turn in all issued uniforms and equipment, will be subject to legal action to obtain the items in question or pay the monetary equivalent.
  - The Sheriff's Office or York County shall be compensated for lost or damaged equipment in excess of normal wear.
    - Compensation must be in the form of a money order or a check made payable to the County of York.

314 • Jewelry

- 315 ○ The following jewelry items may be worn while in uniform:
- 316     ▪ Wristwatches.
- 317     ▪ Watches worn on chains or pinned to the uniform are not permitted.
- 318     ▪ One additional bracelet of a conservative nature other than the watch may be
- 319         worn on the wrists.
- 320     ▪ Rings shall be limited to a total of three rings on both hands.
- 321     ▪ Neck chains and necklaces, if worn, will not be visible.
- 322     ▪ The wearing of earrings by women is authorized.
- 323         ➤ Women may wear (1) one pair of conservative style earrings with a diameter
- 324             of no more than 1/4”.
- 325         ➤ Hoops or hanging earrings are prohibited.
- 326
- 327     ▪ Deputies assigned to narcotics or undercover duties may wear earrings or other
- 328         grooming styles, as approved by the investigations division commander, at the
- 329         discretion of the Sheriff.
- 330     ▪ The jewelry and grooming standards contained in this policy shall apply when
- 331         wearing a Sheriff’s office Uniform.
- 332     ▪ Due to potential safety considerations, arising from deputies engaged in physical
- 333         confrontation or the constraint of arrestees, body piercing, except as authorized
- 334         above, and nose rings are prohibited

336 • Tattoos

- 337 ○ Members shall not appear on duty or in uniform with any visible tattoo that is:
- 338     ▪ Profane
- 339     ▪ Derogatory
- 340     ▪ Suggestive,
- 341     ▪ That displays nudity.
- 342
- 343 ○ Extremist tattoos are forbidden.
- 344 ○ Extremist tattoos are those affiliated with, depicting, or symbolizing:
- 345     ▪ Extremist philosophies, organizations, or activities.
- 346         ❖ Extremist philosophies, organizations, and activities are those that advocate
- 347             racial, gender, or ethnic hatred or intolerance, advocate, create, or engage in
- 348             illegal discrimination based on race, color, gender, ethnicity, religion, or
- 349             national origin.
- 350
- 351 ○ Branding or scarification marks must be covered while on duty or in uniform.
- 352 ○ No tattoos shall be visible on the front of the body above the collar bones
- 353     ○ Any tattoo above the collar bones shall be behind the earlobes
- 354         ▪ This type of tattoo will need to be behind a straight line down from the
- 355             earlobe with the neck fully erect and eyes facing horizontal to the
- 356             ground
- 357 ○ Hand tattoos



- Tattoos on the hands are limited to the space from the wrist to the first joint of the finger
  - No tattoos are permitted to extend onto the fingers
  - No tattoos are permitted to extend on the palm of the hand or underside of the fingers
    - Tattoos on the underside of the arm will not extend below the crease of the wrist
- When judging the appropriateness of tattoos, the opinion will be more conservative than liberal.
- Tattoos that do not meet the criteria above must be covered while on duty or in uniform.
- Deputies wishing to appear in uniform with visible tattoos should approach a supervisor for approval.
- When questionable tattoos exist, the decisions on the appropriateness of the tattoo will be made by the command staff with guidance and approval from the Sheriff.
- Grooming Standards
  - Male
    - Hair shall be kept neat and clean.
    - Hair on the back of the head shall not extend below the top of the shirt collar.
    - Hair shall not cover any portion of the outside of the ear.
    - Hair shall not be worn in any eccentric style such as, but not limited to:
      - ❖ Unconventional design
      - ❖ Unconventional coloring
        - Coloring of the hair shall be limited to any color that is naturally occurring in human hair
      - ❖ When judging the appropriateness of hair styles, the opinion will be more conservative than liberal.
      - ❖ When questionable hair styles exist, the decisions on the appropriateness of the hair style will be made by the command staff with guidance and approval from the Sheriff.
    - Personnel are permitted to grow facial hair to include beards; however, they must comply with the following standards:
      - ❖ Facial hair should be conservative and in a style that would be acceptable in a business environment.
      - ❖ Beards will be kept neatly groomed to no longer than ½ of an inch in length.
      - ❖ Facial hair must not interfere with the ability of the breathing apparatus to seal.
  - Personnel shall notify their supervisor of their intent to grow facial hair and are highly encouraged to follow the guidelines listed below in an effort to minimize poor appearance. Personnel intending on growing a beard must understand they will only have two opportunities to grow a beard per calendar year.

- ❖ Uniform Patrol deputies encouraged to start on midnight shift or their three day break.
- ❖ Investigations, Community Services, Administrative Services and Courthouse Security / Civil deputies are encouraged to start on a Friday.
- When judging the appropriateness of beards, the opinion will be more conservative than liberal.
- Growing of facial hair as a means of not shaving will not be tolerated.
- Sideburns, without the growth of a beard, shall not extend below the bottom of the earlobe and shall be of an even width.
- The bottom of the sideburn shall be trimmed with a clean shaved horizontal line.
- Mustaches shall be groomed
- Fingernails shall be kept clean and neatly trimmed and shall not extend beyond the tips of the fingers or thumbs.
- Grooming Standards
  - Female
    - Hair shall be kept neat and clean.
    - Hair shall not be styled in any fashion that hinders wearing of the uniform hat in the prescribed manner, when required.
    - No decorations shall be worn in the hair except clips or pins that closely match the hair color, or are conservative and modest in nature.
    - Hair shall not be worn in any eccentric style such as, but not limited to:
      - ❖ Unconventional design
      - ❖ Unconventional coloring
        - Coloring of the hair shall be limited to any color that is naturally occurring in human hair
    - ❖ When judging the appropriateness of hair styles, the opinion will be more conservative than liberal.
    - ❖ When questionable hair styles exist, the decisions on the appropriateness of the hair style will be made by the command staff with guidance and approval from the Sheriff.
    - False eyelashes, which are exaggerated or readily identifiable, shall not be permitted or worn.
    - Cosmetics shall be subdued and match the natural color of the skin.
    - Fingernails shall be kept clean and neatly trimmed and shall not extend beyond the tips of the fingers or thumbs.
    - Fingernails may be polished with a conservative color.
  - Court attire
    - On duty personnel.
      - If on-duty, uniform patrol deputies will appear for court in an approved Class A or B uniform.

- Off Duty personnel.
  - If off duty or if working in a special status and authorized to wear civilian clothing, employees shall wear either the approved uniform or appear suitably dressed in civilian business attire.
  - Appropriate civilian business attire shall be:
    - ❖ For men, civilian business attire is defined as tie, dress shirt, dress/semi-dress trousers and sport coat or men's suit.
    - ❖ For women, civilian business attire is defined as a dress; combination of skirt, blouse, and blazer; business suit or pants suit.
  - Personnel assigned to the Investigations Division will appear for court in civilian business attire.
  - Personnel immediately called to court without prior notification may appear in a manner of dress less than specified above, after making notification to their supervisor.

### **Ribbons, Medals, Service Stripes, and Mourning Bands**

- The following list of ribbons may be awarded by the Sheriff for varying degrees of meritorious service.
  - The hierarchy of ribbons is as follows:
    - **Patriot Ribbon (Requirements)**
      - ❖ Employed by the YPSO on 9/11/2001 and on duty.
        - Ribbon with bronze oak leaf.
      - ❖ Employed by the YPSO on 9/11/2001.
        - Ribbon with bronze star.
      - ❖ Employed by the YPSO for 1 year.
        - Ribbon only.
    - **Medal of Honor Ribbon – Posthumously (Requirements)**
      - ❖ This award will be given to the family of a deceased deputy for the loss of life while in the line of duty and who:
        - Displayed outstanding heroism in the line of duty;
        - At great personal risk and with the full knowledge of risk;
        - In the highest tradition of law enforcement.
      - ❖ All of the above criteria listed must be met.
      - ❖ The Sheriff will personally present this honor to the family.
    - **Medal of Honor Ribbon (Requirements)**
      - ❖ This award is presented to a deputy who distinguishes him or herself by:
        - Gallantry and action, above and beyond the call of duty, while serving as a deputy in the Sheriff's Office and displays:

- Outstanding heroism in the line of duty;
- Action(s) beyond the call of duty;
- With the full knowledge of risk;
- The deputy must have displayed unselfish commitment to law enforcement and to the life of another, with great personal risk to his or her own life, or by sustaining serious injury.

- ❖ This award is given at the discretion of the Sheriff and will be worn immediately below the deputy's badge.

▪ **Purple Heart Ribbon (Requirements)**

- ❖ This award is presented to a deputy who sustains serious injury in the line of duty, while actively engaged in a law enforcement action, resulting from:
  - An assault,
  - Fire,
  - Explosion, or
  - Other law enforcement related action while meeting the following criteria:
    - ✓ The deputy must have been actively engaged in a law enforcement action, in the line of duty.
    - ✓ The deputy must sustain serious injury, from assault, fire explosion, or other law enforcement related action.
    - ✓ The deputy exercised all responsible safety precautions possible
    - ✓ And the deputy's actions were consistent with Sheriff's Office policies and procedures.
    - ✓ The Purple Heart will not be awarded for injuries sustained in
    - ✓ Training accidents.
    - ✓ Motor vehicle accidents except in case where clear evidence indicates that the deputy exercised all responsible safety precautions and had no reasonable control over the circumstances, and the deputy's actions were consistent with Sheriff's Office policies and/or procedures.

▪ **Combat Cross Ribbon (Requirements)**

- ❖ This award is presented to a deputy who, during the course of their duties, was actively engaged in a law enforcement related combat action when:
  - The perpetrator would have actually applied a dangerous weapon toward or at the deputy, or another person with the intent to seriously injure or kill the deputy or other person and,
  - The deputy must have met this threat with deadly force.
    - ✓ The mere pointing of a firearm, knife or other weapon toward a deputy does not constitute combat.

- ❖ The deputy must have been involved in combat with an armed adversary during the course of the deputy's duties with a suspect who by their actions posed a serious threat of death or serious injury to the deputy or others by applying the weapon at or toward the deputy.

- The mere pointing of a firearm, knife or other weapon is insufficient for combat requirement

- **Life Saving Ribbon (Requirements)**

- ❖ This award is presented to a deputy for:
- ❖ Preventing death or grave injury to a third party, while in the line of duty, by the deputy's direct actions and training while:
  - Under hazardous conditions, or
  - At a risk to the deputy's safety.

- **CPR/AED Ribbon (Requirements)**

- ❖ This award is presented to a deputy who:
- ❖ Performs actions resulting in a third party surviving a fatal, or potentially fatal event, with no hazardous or safety risk to the deputy, through:
  - Successful administration of CPR, or
  - Successful deployment and administration of the AED, or
  - Successful administration of NARCAN.

- **Sheriff's Special Commendation Ribbon (Requirements)**

- ❖ This award is presented to any Sheriff's Office employee who exhibits outstanding performance of duty under unusual or difficult conditions.
- ❖ The action need not involve exposure to physical danger, but must involve:
- ❖ Unusual thoroughness or conscientiousness, determination and initiative or,
- ❖ Consists of a meritorious action of a nature which would not be eligible for a higher award or,
- ❖ By the employee's continuing performance and display of devotion to the Sheriff's Office and the County of York.
- ❖ Outstanding performance of duty under unusual or difficult conditions.
- ❖ A letter of commendation from the Sheriff does not suffice for this award

- **Deputy of the Year Ribbon (Requirements)**

- ❖ This award is presented to any deputy who has been recognized for his or her level of service, commitment, dedication, integrity, or who acted as a standard for other employees to follow and who brings acclaim to the York Poquoson Sheriff's Office.
- ❖ A deputy must be selected by the County or one of the recognized civic or community groups who routinely present a Deputy of the Year award.

- ❖ Must be an employee with the York-Poquoson Sheriff's Office, and
  - Who during the year exemplifies themselves for service, commitment, dedication and integrity, and
  - By doing so, sets a standard for other employees to follow and brings acclaim to the York-Poquoson Sheriff's Office.
  - Must be selected by the YPSO, County, a civic group, or community group as Deputy of the Year.

▪ **Military Veteran Ribbon (Requirements)**

- ❖ The award is presented to deputies who currently or have served, either active duty, National Guard or Reserves, and were honorably discharged, with either:
  - The United States Army or,
  - The United States Navy or,
  - The United States Air Force or,
  - The United States Marine Corp or,
  - The United States Coast Guard.

▪ **Past Law Enforcement Service Ribbon (Requirements)**

- The award is presented to deputies who have:
  - ❖ Served with a certified law enforcement agency for at least 3 years, and
  - ❖ Have left prior service in good standing.

▪ **Career Ladder Ribbon (Requirements)**

- ❖ The award is presented to deputies who meet the requirements under Policy [RR 1-12A, Deputy Sheriff Career Ladder Program](#) and:
  - Achieve the status of Deputy First Class.
    - ✓ Career ladder ribbon only.
  - Achieve the status of Master Deputy.
    - ✓ Career ladder ribbon with oak leaf cluster.

▪ **Education Achievement Ribbon (Requirements)**

- ❖ This award is presented to an employee of the York-Poquoson Sheriff's Office who consistently strives for educational achievement and has enhanced the level of service rendered to this office and public, through the benefit of their education and training and:
  - Earned at least an Associate's Degree in the Criminal Justice field from an accredited college or university.
    - ✓ Educational achievement ribbon only.
  - Earned a Bachelor's Degree from an accredited college or university
    - ✓ Educational achievement ribbon with 1 star.

- Earned a Master's Degree from an accredited college or university.
  - ✓ Educational achievement ribbon with 2 stars.

- Earned a PhD from an accredited college or university.
  - ✓ Educational achievement ribbon with 3 stars.

- **FBI National Academy Ribbon (Requirements)**

- ❖ This ribbon is presented to deputies who have:
  - ✓ Successfully completed the FBI National Academy.

- **Forensic Science Academy Graduate Ribbon (Requirements)**

- ❖ This ribbon is presented to deputies who have:
  - ✓ Successfully completed the Virginia Forensic Science Academy.

- **Pistol Achievement Ribbon and Medal (Requirements)**

- ❖ This ribbon and pin is awarded to deputies who achieve the qualifying scores with their issued duty weapon (Pistol).
- ❖ This ribbon or medal may be worn during the year following the qualifying score.
- ❖ Deputies achieving a qualifying score three consecutive years are permanently awarded the associated ribbon and medal unless a higher qualifying score is achieved.
- ❖ Deputies awarded a ribbon or pin for a higher qualifying score, after receiving a permanent award may wear the ribbon or medal associated with the higher qualifying score for the year following the achievement.
- ❖ If a deputy fails to maintain the higher qualifying score in either of the two years following the higher award, they shall revert back to the previously awarded permanent ribbon or medal.
- ❖ Deputies who achieve the higher qualifying score 3 consecutive shall be awarded the higher ribbon and medal for permanent wear.
- ❖ Awarded permanent wear ribbons or medals may be worn regardless of subsequent qualifying scores.
- ❖ Qualifying scores and ribbons and medals awarded are as follows:
  - Score of 93-97% on the initial daytime annual qualification.
    - ✓ Ribbon and medal only.
  - Score of 98-100% on the initial daytime annual qualification.
    - ✓ Ribbon with a single bronze star and medal.
  - Score of 93-97% on the initial daytime annual qualification for 3 consecutive years.
    - ✓ Ribbon with 2 bronze stars and medal. (Permanent wear)
  - Score of 98-100% on the initial daytime annual qualification for 3 consecutive years.

✓ Ribbon with 3 bronze stars and medal. (Permanent wear)

▪ **Rifle Achievement Ribbon (Requirements)**

- ❖ This ribbon is awarded to deputies who achieve the qualifying scores with their issued duty weapon (Patrol Rifle).
- ❖ The qualifying scores required for award of this ribbon shall be the same criteria as the qualifying scores for award of the Pistol Achievement Ribbon above.

▪ **Crime Prevention Specialist Ribbon (Requirements)**

- ❖ A deputy must obtain or previously obtained DCJS certification as a crime prevention specialist

▪ **DARE Mentor Ribbon (Requirements)**

- ❖ A deputy must obtain or previously obtained DARE America certification as a DARE Mentor.

▪ **Field Training Officer Ribbon (Requirements)**

- ❖ To be awarded this ribbon a deputy must:
  - Be a current agency approved FTO.
    - ✓ FTO ribbon and collar brass.
  - Be a former YPSO approved FTO.
    - ✓ FTO ribbon only.
- ❖ Completion of the DCJS FTO course does not qualify a deputy for this ribbon. To qualify for this ribbon, the deputy must be or have been a Sheriff's Office approved FTO.

▪ **Traffic Enforcement Specialist Ribbon (Requirements)**

- ❖ To be awarded this ribbon a deputy must have certification in, attended and completed formal training in or be a part of any 5 of the following:
  - Police motorcycle operator.
  - Accident reconstruction basic.
  - Accident reconstruction advanced.
  - Accident reconstruction motorcycle.
  - RADAR/LIDAR operator.
  - Breath alcohol operator.
  - DUI Task Force Member.

▪ **Emergency Response Team Ribbon (Requirements)**

- ❖ To be awarded this ribbon a deputy must:
  - Serve for at least three (3) years as an ERT member.

  - Upon successful completion the deputy will be awarded the ribbon only.

  - Upon successful completion the deputy will be awarded the CIT ribbon with a bronze star.

▪ **School Resource Officer Ribbon (Requirements)**

- ❖ To be awarded this ribbon a deputy must:
  - Successfully Complete basic SRO training and
  - Be assigned to a York County school as a SRO for 1 full school year.

▪ **Public Information Officer Ribbon (Requirements)**

- ❖ To be awarded this ribbon a deputy must:
  - Be assigned or designated as a YPSO PIO for a minimum of 3 years.

▪ **DARE Officer Ribbon (Requirements)**

- ❖ To be awarded this ribbon a deputy must:
  - Successfully complete the DARE training course, and
  - Be assigned as a YPSO DARE officer for a minimum of 3 years

▪ **Crime Prevention Officer Ribbon (Requirements)**

822       ▪ **Weapons Qualification medal**

- 823       ❖ A pistol weapons qualification medal may be worn consistent with the
- 824       awarded Weapons Qualification ribbon.
- 825       ➤ The pistol weapons qualification medal shall be worn no more than
- 826       1/4" above and centered along the top of the right breast pocket.

828       ▪ **Patriot Medal**

- 829       ❖ A Patriot medal may be worn consistent with the awarded Patriot

- 831       ➤ The Patriot ribbon shall always be worn in a place of prominence

- 850       ➤ Deputies who have earned both the Combat Cross and the Sheriff's

- 852       centered on the left breast pocket flap with the top of the medals

857       ▪ **Military Service Pin**

- 858       ❖ Deputies who have earned the Military Veteran ribbon may also wear
- 859       a Military Service pin.

- ❖ Deputies who served in multiple branches of the military must choose which service pin they wish to receive.
- ❖ Deputies who served in multiple branched of the military may only wear one (1) military service pin.
- ❖ The Military Service pin shall be issued by the Sheriff's Office.
- ❖ The Military Service pin shall be worn on the right breast pocket flap centered between the left edge of the name tag and left edge if the pockets flap.
- ❖ The Military Service pin will denote the following:
- ❖ Branch of Service.

- The deputy receiving the Military Service pin may request the following denoted on the pin:
  - ❖ Branch of Service only, or
  - ❖ Branch of Service and Veteran, or
  - ❖ Branch of Service and Retired.

- **Wearing of ribbons**

- There is a [Ribbon Chart](#) in the Forms folder in PowerDMS that displays the hierarchy and an image of each ribbon
- The precedence of wear shall be the order the medal requirements are listed above.
- Ribbons shall be worn left to right, top to bottom in hierarchy.
- The Patriot Ribbon shall be worn as the highest precedent ribbon on the top left side, since it represents the flag of the United States of America.
- Ribbons shall only be worn during special occasions and only with the Class "A" Uniform.

- **Authorization to wear ribbons**

- Only the ribbons and appliances approved in this directive shall be worn while in uniform

- **Years of service stripes**

- Years of Service stipes are presented to employees of the York-Poquoson Sheriff's Office for years of commitment, dedication, and service with the York-Poquoson Sheriff's Office and are awarded as follows:
  - ❖ Sworn employee (career or auxiliary) with the York-Poquoson Sheriff's Office, and
  - ❖ Served continuously for five years or more.
    - One stripe will be awarded for each five (5) years of service
  - ❖ Years of Service stripes will be worn on the outside of the lower left sleeve only on long sleeve shirts and dress coats.

- **Black Mourning Bands**

- 905           ▪ Black mourning bands worn over badges are to show respect for fallen law
- 906           enforcement officers who die in the line of duty.
- 907           ▪ Mourning Bands will only be worn at the direction of the Sheriff or his
- 908           designee.
- 909           ▪ Mourning bands may either be:
- 910           ❖ Solid black, or
- 911           ❖ Black with thin blue line.
