General:

- A Korean War Veteran license plates, which bear the name of the appropriate branch of the armed service may be issued to any veteran of the armed forces of the United States who served during the Korean War.
- These plates are issued for private passenger automobiles, vans, private trucks up to 16,000 lbs., motorcycles, and motor homes.¹
- Credit will not be allowed for a valid plate currently on the vehicle when the special plate is issued, due to the plate being a free plate.
- Plates may be transferred from one vehicle in applicant's name to another vehicle in applicant's name, but cannot be transferred between owners.

Requirements:

- Proof of service, such as a *DD214* form, which indicates the applicant served during the Korean War **and** had an Honorable, Under Honorable Conditions or a General Under Honorable Conditions discharge.
- A photocopy of the registration certificate of the vehicle on which the plate will be placed if the vehicle is currently registered.
 - If the vehicle is not registered in the applicant's name, all <u>necessary documentation</u> required for titling of the vehicle must be submitted along with the request, in addition to the request for the Korean War Veteran license plate.
- To apply for a special plate, you may do one of the following:
 - Apply through the Specialized Vehicle Unit (P.O. Box 64886, Baton Rouge, LA 70896) for immediate issuance.
 - Apply at any <u>Office of Motor Vehicles or Public Tag Agency location</u>. Immediate issuance is based on availability at that office.
 - View and order specialty license plate on <u>Expresslane.org</u>. Specialty plate will be mailed once the application is received and processed by the Office of Motor Vehicles.

Fees:

- This is a free, lifetime plate.
- \$10.00 Replacement fee due for a lost or stolen plate
- \$8.00 Handling fee due on all transactions
- \$3.00 Transfer of the plate to another vehicle
