Section: 5. Motor Vehicle License Plate Classification and Requirements

General:

 Effective September 6, 1985, by administrative approval, the Office of Motor Vehicles will issue prestige handicapped license plates. The plates cannot have more than six characters. These plates will be issued to private passenger automobiles/vans, private use trucks up to 16,000 lbs., and private buses.

Eligibility

- Any mobility impaired person whose impairment is permanent is eligible for a prestige handicapped license plate.
- The term "mobility impaired person" will include any person who is impaired because of any of the following conditions:
 - Cannot walk two hundred feet without stopping to rest.
 - Cannot walk without the assistance of another person, walker, cane crutches, braces, prosthetic device, or wheelchair. This includes individuals who are blind or have such a visual impairment that the assistance of another person is necessary to walk.
 - Is restricted by a lung disease to such an extent that the person's forced (respiratory) expiratory volume for one second, when measured by spirometry, is less than one liter, or the arterial oxygen tension is less than sixty mm/hg on room air at rest.
 - Uses portable oxygen.
 - Has a cardiac condition to the extent that the person's functional limitations are classified in severity as Class III or Class IV according to standards set by the American Heart Association.
 - Has a diagnosed disease or disorder, including a severe arthritic, neurological or orthopedic impairment, which creates a severe mobility limitation.

Requirements:

- To apply for a Prestige Handicapped license plate, the applicant must submit the following items:
 - A copy of the registration certificate of the vehicle on which the plate will be placed. If the vehicle is not registered in the applicant's name, all necessary documentation required for titling the vehicle must be submitted along with the request for the Prestige Handicapped license plate.
 - A completed <u>DPSMV 1619</u> (Request for Personalized Prestige License Plate) form.
 - A currently dated medical examiner's statement (<u>DPSMV 1966 form</u>) certifying that the applicant is mobility impaired. The medical examiner's certification must state how long the physical condition which qualifies the applicant for a prestige handicapped plate is expected to last. "Medical examiner" is defined as a person licensed to practice medicine by the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners, a person licensed to practice chiropractic by the Louisiana State Board of Chiropractic Examiners, a person licensed by the Louisiana State Board of Physical Therapy Examiners, or an advanced practice registered nurse.
 - PERMANENTLY IMPAIRED means the condition is certified as total or lifelong; therefore, the Medical Examiner's certification will be required on initial application only. Re-certification SHALL NOT be required upon renewal.
 - An applicant whose medical examiner's certification is marked TEMPORARILY IMPAIRED is NOT eligible to receive a Prestige Handicapped license plate. A temporarily impaired individual can only qualify for a mobility impaired hang tag. See Section V, Policy/Procedure Statement #14.7 for procedures.
 - Applicable fees.

Fees:

- \$25.00 per year license plate fee in addition to regular registration fees.
- \$25.00 annual fee shall be collected upon all subsequent renewals.
- \$8.00 handling fee due on all transactions except renewals.
- \$3.50 administrative handling fee due only on the initial issuance.
- \$3.00 transfer the plate to another vehicle in the applicant's name.

Notes:

- It takes approximately two to four months for a Handicapped Prestige license plate to be manufactured; therefore, the applicant must have a current license plate on the vehicle before ordering this type plate.
- All requests for initial issuance of the special license plate must be mailed to the Specialized Vehicle Unit, Headquarters, P.O. Box 64886, Baton Rouge, LA. 70896.
 Renewals and transfers can be processed by any motor vehicle office or public tag agent.
